WITNESS AND EXHIBIT LIST**

Pursuant to the Hearing Officer's Order Scheduling Remand Hearing dated May 19, 2015 ("Remand Hearing Order"), the City of Albuquerque Environmental Health Department files its Witness list and Exhibit list below.

WITNESSES

1. **Mary Lou Leonard, Director, Environmental Health Department, City of Albuquerque.**

Mary Lou Leonard ("Ms. Leonard") will testify that she is the Director of the City of Albuquerque Environmental Health Department ("EHD") and oversees all EHD activities which include the Air Quality, Consumer Health, Environmental Services, Strategic Support, and Urban Biology Programs. She will testify that she understands the purpose of the Air Board hearing to be an inquiry into whether the request from Pat Toledo ("Mr. Toledo") and Andy Carrasco ("Mr. Carrasco") and the emailed inquiries from the neighborhood association constituted significant public interest in an air quality permit modification for a Smith's gas

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station at Tramway SE. She will testify that she understands that the Albuquerque-Bernalillo County Air Quality Control Board (“Air Board”) is reviewing her decision to deny a public hearing request submitted by Mr. Toledo and Mr. Carrasco because she determined that there was not significant public interest.

She will testify that at the time she decided to deny their public hearing request, their request was the only request for a public hearing that the Air Quality Program had received. She will testify that she understood at the time that two neighborhood associations had posed inquiries which her staff had answered and that no neighborhood association had requested a hearing.

She will testify that she knew that the Air Quality Program had been in direct contact with the designated representatives of those two associations and that she knew at that time that the two associations had not requested a hearing. She will testify that she did not understand the Association’s inquiries as indications that they desired further information beyond the answers to the questions they had posed.

She will testify that she knew that Mr. Toledo’s and Mr. Carrasco’s joint request for a public hearing had stated that they were “in alliance with the 4-hills neighborhood association.” She will testify that she gave the fact that the Associations had not requested a hearing on their own behalf more weight than Mr. Toledo’s and Mr. Carrasco’s statement of being “in alliance with” an association. As a result, she viewed Mr. Toledo’s and Mr. Carrasco’s request as coming from two individuals rather than from an association.

She will testify that she considers each request for a public hearing on a case by case basis. She will testify that, since December 2009 when she became EHD Director, this is the

only public hearing she has denied. She will testify that she understands that she must provide a requested public hearing if she determines that there is significant public interest.

She will testify that she denied Mr. Toledo's and Mr. Carrasco's public hearing request because it was a request by two individuals and she determined that a request from two individuals did not demonstrate "significant public interest."

She will testify that she is required to wisely manage the public resources entrusted to her. Because she found that there was not significant public interest, she considered the Program resources that would be used for a public hearing and she considered her responsibility to manage those resources wisely. She also considered that when a public hearing is denied, it does not preclude public participation. Because there was not significant public interest and Mr. Toledo and Mr. Carrasco could continue to participate in the public process, she decided to deny their request for a public hearing.

2. Isreal Tavaréz, Environmental Health Manager, Permitting Division, Air Quality Program, Environmental Health Department, City of Albuquerque.

Isreal Tavaréz ("Mr. Tavaréz") will testify that he is the Environmental Health Manager of the EHD Air Quality Program Permitting Division and that he oversees all Permitting Division activities which include reviewing air quality permit applications and making final decisions on air quality permit applications.

He will testify that he understands the purpose of the Air Board hearing to be an inquiry into whether the request from Mr. Toledo and Mr. Carrasco and the emailed inquiries from the neighborhood association constituted significant public interest in an air quality permit modification for a Smith's gas station at Tramway SE. He will testify that he understands that the Air Board is reviewing the EHD Director's decision to deny a public hearing request

submitted by Mr. Toledo and Mr. Carrasco. He will testify that he recommended to the EHD Director that she should deny the public hearing because there was not significant public interest.

He will testify that at the time he recommended to the EHD Director to deny Mr. Toledo's and Mr. Carrasco's public hearing request, their request was the only request for a public hearing that the Air Quality Program had received. He will testify that he understood at the time that two neighborhood associations had posed inquiries which his staff had answered and that no neighborhood association had requested a hearing.

He will testify that he knew that Mr. Toledo's and Mr. Carrasco's joint request for a public hearing stated that they were "in alliance with the 4-hills neighborhood association." He will testify that his Deputy Director, Mr. Bill Westmoreland, had questioned him about this aspect because no association had signed their request. He will testify that he responded at the time that the Program had no evidence of such an alliance.

Mr. Tavaréz will testify that because he had no evidence of such an alliance and because he knew the Air Quality Program had been in direct contact with the designated representatives of neighborhood associations and that they had not requested a public hearing, he recommended to the EHD Director that she deny Mr. Toledo's and Mr. Carrasco's request for a public hearing.

He will testify that he always considers each request for a public hearing on the facts and circumstances of each situation when making a recommendation to the EHD Director. He will testify that public hearings take significant Program resources when they are held.

He will testify that, since Mary Lou Leonard has been EHD Director, there have been six requests for public hearings about pending permit applications and that he recommended granting requests in five of the six. His recommendation was followed in each case. He will

testify that each of the five requests which were granted demonstrated much broader interest than Mr. Toledo's and Mr. Carrasco's request.

He will testify that he recommended to the EHD Director to deny this public hearing request because it was a request by two individuals who were not authorized to represent anyone else. He recommended that a request by two individuals did not demonstrate "significant public interest."

He will testify that he understands that regardless of whether a public hearing is held, individuals may still participate in the air quality permitting process by commenting to the Program during the public comment period on the air quality permit application, by requesting information regarding the application or by discussing the permit application with the assigned Permitting staff. Additionally, after EHD makes a decision on a permit application, any individual who participated in the air quality permitting process for that application who is adversely affected can appeal EHD's decision to the Air Board. He will testify that denying a public hearing does not prevent these kinds of public participation.

Mr. Barsis,

Certainly. I am glad to answer any of your questions.

I can tell you what the Smith's is "permitted" for, which is greater than what they will actually emit. Their permitted emissions limit for volatile organic carbon (VOC) will increase from 25.4 to 32.5 tons per year.

There is a Valero and a Giant station at Eubank and Central. The Valero recently modified its permit to increase its gasoline throughput to 3,000,000 gallons per year and is now permitted to emit 20 tons of VOC per year. The Giant is permitted for 2,400,000 gallons per year throughput and is permitted to emit 15.6 tons of VOC per year.

Please let me know the name of the gas station across the street from the Smith's and I will look up information on that one as well.

The permitted limit is what they are allowed to emit in their permit (what they cannot exceed), which is greater than what they will actually emit.

The City of Albuquerque, Environmental Health Department, Air Quality Division (Division) is responsible for the review and issuance of Air Quality Permits for any source of air contaminants within Bernalillo County. Once an application is deemed complete, the Division is required to provide at least 45 (but no more than 60) days for public comment on each application. Re: "Appeal" of EHD Director's Decision Not to Hold Public Information Hearing About Smith's Application to Modify (Increase) Gasoline Throughput at Tramway and Central SE Gas Station

Gentlemen:

This letter is in response to your letter to me that is dated May 23, 2013, in which you stated you "are appealing the decision not to initiate a public hearing on the Smith's gas station request at Tramway and Central to increase there *[sic]* throughput from 3.9 million gallons a year to 5.0 million gallons..." As has been discussed with you several times, and as was stated by the hearing officer when you both attended the public information hearing (PIH) regarding Smith's Food & Drug Centers, Inc. (Smith's) application for an increase in gasoline throughput at the separate Smith's gas station at Carlisle and Constitution NE: a PIH is not a formal hearing on the merits. No findings or recommendations are made at the end of the PIH. The assigned City of Albuquerque (City) Environmental Health Department (Department) permit writer does not make a decision at the end of a PIH. The decision regarding whether a PIH is warranted under the circumstances is in the sole discretion of the Department Director.

The New Mexico Air Quality Control Act (Air Act), the City Joint Air Quality Control Board (Air Board) Ordinance (City Ordinance) and the applicable minor stationary source Air Board permitting regulation do not require a hearing or meeting before the permit writer makes a final decision regarding the pending application. The permitting regulation does require an application that is administratively complete, public notice published in the *Albuquerque Journal* and opportunity for public comment. The public notice must include specific information regarding the proposed permit or permit modification and must identify the manner in which comments or evidence on the application may be submitted to the Department. All legal requirements were met. The Department also included additional information in the public notice, such as the availability of the application for inspection and the deadline for public comment and requesting a public information hearing.

As you know from the May 14, 2013 letter that I sent to you, Air Board regulation 20.11.41.14.B NMAC states: "The department shall hold a public hearing if the director determines that there is significant public interest." Although the Department was not required to do so by the permitting regulation, the Department sent an email with an attached 8 1/2" x 11" copy of the public notice to two neighborhood associations, three home owners' associations and one neighborhood coalition in the area surrounding the Tramway and Central SE gas station. As a result of the public notice and emails, the Department received a few inquiries from an officer with the Executive Hills Home Owners' Association and the President of the Four Hills Village Neighborhood Association. The Department responded to the inquiries and heard nothing more from any of the organizations that


surround the Tramway and Central SE gas station. No individual residing in the area submitted public comment or requested a PIH. As you know, the only requests for a PIH regarding the Tramway and Central SE gas station application for modification came from: Andy Carrasco, who owns a commercial property near the Smith's Carlisle and Constitution NE gas station, and Pat Toledo, who is a resident of the Summit Park NA in the area of the Carlisle and Constitution NE gas station.

Regarding your request for a PIH re the Tramway and Central SE gas station, and as I stated in the May 14 letter, I determined that the Tramway and Central SE application for modification did not generate "significant public interest". My decision in this matter is discretionary. No formal appeal process applies to the Department Director's decision not to hold a PIH. As you also know from the May 23, 2013 participant notification letter to you that was signed by Acting Deputy Director Danny Nevarez, the requested modification was issued because the application was complete, the public notice requirements were met, the Department conducted its review as required and there was no legal basis for the Department to deny the modification.

In Mr. Carrasco's challenge to the Carlisle and Constitution NE Smith's gas station application for modification, Mr. Carrasco was represented by attorney Pete V. Domenici, Jr. Mr. Domenici also submitted an extensive Inspection of Public Records Act request to the Department regarding all of the Smith's gas stations in Bernalillo County. We have received no notice that Mr. Domenici has withdrawn as Mr. Carrasco's attorney in the Carlisle and Constitution NE matter. We are sending Mr. Domenici a copy of this response letter so you can consult with him regarding the Smith's Tramway and Central SE matter, if appropriate.
