Enforcement Program

- ◆ Conduct EPA inspections of stationary sources consistent with Compliance Monitoring Strategy (CMS)
 - ✓ The Clean Air Act and CMS requires that major sources should be inspected once every two (2) years
 - ✓ The Clean Air Act and CMS requires that 80% of synthetic minors should be inspected once every five (5) years.
- ◆ Conduct inspections of stationary sources as described in the Local Inspection Plan
- ◆ Surveillance of stationary sources
- ◆ Enforce Federal CAA, New Mexico Air Quality Control Act, Albuquerque/Bernalillo County Air Quality Control Board Regulations
- ◆ Assessment of Civil and Administrative Penalties

Fugitive Dust Control Program (20.11.20 NMAC)



Fugitive Dust Control Construction Permits

- ◆ Any person who plans to conduct active operations that will disturb $\frac{3}{4}$ of an acre, but not more than 25 acres, shall submit a fugitive dust permit application no fewer than 10 working days before beginning active operations.
- ◆ Any person who plans to conduct active operations that will disturb more than 25 acres of total land surface shall submit a fugitive dust permit application no fewer than 20 working days before beginning active operations.
- ◆ Approved fugitive dust control permits are valid for one year from the date of approval, but no more than 5 years.
- ◆ Active operations means any anthropogenic activity that is capable of generating, or generates fugitive dust, including but not limited to:
 - ✓ bulk material storage, handling or processing
 - ✓ Earthmoving
 - ✓ soil or surface disturbance (e.g. discing, trenching, blading, scraping, clearing, grubbing, topsoil removal)
 - ✓ construction, renovation, or demolition activities
 - ✓ movement of motorized vehicles on any paved or unpaved roadway or surface
 - ✓ right-of-way
 - ✓ lot or parking area, or
 - ✓ the tracking out or transport of bulk material ontop any paved or unpaved roadway

Fugitive Dust Control Programmatic Permits

- ◆ Fugitive dust permit valid for up to 5 years issued to permittee that performs routine maintenance or routine ongoing active operations on land or facilities, which does not include full depth reconstruction of a roadway or substantial removal and replacement of a manmade facility.

Fugitive Dust Control



◆ Fugitive Dust Workshop

- ✓ 20.11.20 NMAC requires that the City of Albuquerque Environmental Health Department, Air Quality Division (Division) to provide public education regarding reducing fugitive dust; and
- ✓ The Division shall implement a program to provide training at not cost to individuals who are or may in the future be required to comply with provisions of this part.
- ✓ Approximately twice per year, the Division provides training and workshops on fugitive dust and control.

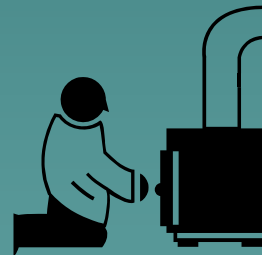

Asbestos

- ◆ Asbestos NESHAP 40 CFR 61, Subpart M
- ◆ Asbestos NESHAP notification
- ◆ Determination of facility compliance with NESHAP
- ◆ Assessment of Civil and Administrative Penalties

Wood-Burning (No-Burn) Patrol

- ◆ Send out wood-burning exemption letters to all individuals issued a wood-burning exemption the previous year
- ◆ Approval of Wood-burning exemptions
- ◆ Conduct inspection of residence prior to exemption issuance
- ◆ No-Burn patrol
- ◆ Surveillance
- ◆ Assessment of Civil and Administrative Penalties



Air Quality Complaints

- ◆ Respond to air quality complaints received through CRM/311 or the Air Quality Division main line
- ◆ Complaints can be filed and received from:
 - ✓ Citizens
 - ✓ Neighborhood associations
 - ✓ Environmental groups
 - ✓ Businesses
 - ✓ Government entities and municipalities (i.e. Bernalillo County, State of New Mexico)
 - ✓ City Councilors
 - ✓ County Commissioners
 - ✓ State Senators and Representatives
