Service Activity Purpose and Description

The creation of the Community Enforcement and Abatement Division for FY/03 addresses the Administrations concerns over the enforcement of City codes and ordinances. The division will concentrate its efforts in the enforcement of City codes and ordinances; such as housing code enforcement, graffiti vandalism prosecution, vehicle forfeiture proceedings, and Metropolitan Court Arraignment Program.

- Expansion of City vehicle Boot Program for 2nd DWU offenders.
- Initiate civil lawsuits against "Graffiti vandals."
- Initiate civil court action on foreclosure issues & board up nuisance properties.
- Initiate enforcement of Vacant Building Ordinance
- Initiate enforcement of Clandestine Lab Cleanup Ordinance

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Strategic Accomplishments

- Fy05 accomplishments:
 authorship and subsequent City Council enactment of Vacant Building Ordinance.
- Authorship and subsequent City Council enactment of Clandestine Lab Cleanup Ordinance.

The SCSF continues to operate the Metropolitan Court Traffic Arraignment Program. At mid-year 30,000 cases were scheduled for arraignment, with approximately 25,000 cases disposed of with plea nad disposition agreements. The program results in an 86% conviction rate on traffic citations.

Secured permanent injunction closing Louie's Fle Market and initiated a lawsuit closing the Star Flea Market. Both were located on the west side and considered magnets for crime.

Actions by the SCSF closed the Phoenix Bar in the northeast heights which was the target of drive by shootings against police officers.

Actions by the SCSF resulted in tearing downthe Royal Hotel on Central.
