
I have good news to report about the North Domingo Baca Multigenerational Center regarding the non-functioning fountain in the foyer. I previously reported that the Departments of Senior Affairs and Cultural Services worked together to find a functional and beautiful piece of art to fill this space. We are well into the process of commissioning the 3 various sized basalt columns and will be able to hand-select the stones when they are back in stock in September or October. We have also been able to get a crew to start preparing the basin in the meantime to be ready for the beautiful water features when they come in. I can't wait to see them once they are put in. The visual impact plus the calming sounds of the water will be a great feature to have in the entrance of the center.
