## Discussion: Interactions with the Court Systems

Kelly reviewed with Andy the City and Criminal Justice Jail Management Initiatives.

Three main items came out of the meeting:

## 1. Warrants:

- Fines attached to warrant- behavioral health/homeless population no money to pay and therefore time needs to be served in jail for the fine.
- Judge that has issued the warrant needs to hear the warrant
- Warrants stop defendants from securing housing, id's, their license is suspended as a result of the warrant. Employment cannot be secured without a license or identification card.

## 2. Statutes:

- Amend statutes for misdemeanor charges to have defined jail days.
- Examples of charges: Pan Handling, Disorderly Conduct, Urinating in Public, Drinking in Public.
- Bench warrants would not have to be issued, fee would not be attached to the case and the case could be closed.
- Rural areas could still collect their fines.

## 3. Competency:

- Discussion regarding Evaluations at Metro, Full Evaluations at District Court/Metro.
- Do statutes need to change? If the Evaluation comes back competent and the attorney
  is not in agreement, the attorney may request for another evaluation/evaluator or a
  full evaluation. This takes time and if the defendant is still in custody, additional jail
  time associated with the case.
- If the defendant is found incompetent, the case is closed and the defendant is not referred to services. Can time be lengthened under supervision?
- Is there a way to still have judicial oversight to address referral to services?
- With Felony cases the stakes are higher.
- The criminal evaluation is to address if the defendant understands the charges and the civil evaluation is to see if the defendant can take care of his life.
- 4. Dangerousness- Can the jurisdiction be extended when the defendant is not dangerous? Can the statute be changed for extenuating circumstances?
