

## AGES 6-10 SPRING BREAK ART!

Get creative and blow off some steam this Spring Break with art projects that encourage you to experiment with a range of materials. Choose morning, afternoon or both sessions.

**March 12, 13, 14**  
**(Tuesday-Thursday)**

### 10 – 12 p.m. CALL IT CALDER

Alexander Calder was an American sculptor best known as the creator of the mobile. Using wire, cloth, wood, found and repurposed objects students will create their very own movable masterpieces. They will also make primary color screen prints inspired by Calder's love of color.

### 1 – 3 p.m. FOILED AGAIN!

From sculpture to enameling, foil is one of the most versatile mediums on the market. In this class students will learn about artists who use metal in 2D and 3D and create their very own masterpieces inspired by these works.
