# Meet our Faculty

In 2006, Lauren opened Meltdown Studio, a jewelry and small metals school and an open studio workspace. Meltdown was created by a community of artists who are interested in teaching, learning, and sharing techniques within the field of small metals and jewelry. Lauren's passion for metalwork is paired with her enthusiasm for sharing its many fascinating qualities with her students.
