*Welcome to the Library* by Alyse Sweeney


An introduction to the library that lets the reader know all the types of materials available with a library card. The duties of a librarian and what to expect in a library are described.

*Maiasaura and Other Dinosaurs of the Midwest* by Dougal Dixon



Obie is a penguin chick growing up on Tuxedo Island. His life from the day he hatches to age five weeks is told with a simple vocabulary.




## Kids' Computer Camp Celebrates!






