**Eric Froberg (Facilitator) called the meeting to order**

**(4:37 pm)**

- Welcome and Introductions**

Eric Froberg called the meeting to order and initiated a roll call of attendees.

***To allow additional time for GABAC members to arrive and achieve a quorum the Public Comment section was moved to the first agenda item.***

• **Public Comment**

Ann Overstreet provided a debrief of the 2018 Bike Meet and Greet. Ms. Overstreet thanked everyone that participated.

***During the Public Comment period, a quorum was achieved.***

**University Multimodal Improvements – Phase 2**

Andrew Varoz, COA-DMD, provided an update on the University Multimodal Improvements – Phase 2 project. The presentation (see attached) included a re-introduction to the project, proposed project schedule, discussion of the various trail and striping segments of the overall project, and next steps for the project.

Mr. Varoz stated the design plans are at 90% with the next step being right-of-way acquisitions. Dan Majewski asked if the acquisition were from other agencies or private owners, with Mr. Varoz stating both.

Jim Fordice asked how northbound riders on University would continue north near the curve at Randolph Avenue. Mr. Varoz highlighted the median refuge near the University Blvd/Flightway Ave intersection as the crossing point to allow riders to continue north along the trail section and down the proposed ramp section to access Kirtland Park. Riders would continue north and rejoin University Blvd north of Kirtland Park.

Scot Key inquired about a “road diet” on Randolph Avenue. Mr. Varoz stated that Randolph Avenue would receive signing and striping improvements, but a physical “road diet” was not part of this project. The Randolph Avenue signing and striping improvements would encourage a shared road facility.

Scot Key asked if a paved section could be added from the Transport Street alignment to a future South Diversion Channel trail. Mr. Varoz stated that would be outside the current project limits and was not included.

Jim Fordice asked about wayfinding for these various segments. In particular, how northbound University Blvd users would know to use the Sunport Segment and the previously discussed segment through Kirtland Park. Mr. Varoz stated that wayfinding will be included with the project and could be provided to GABAC for comment.

- **GABAC Committee Reports**

- **2018 Bike Meet and Greet Debrief**

GABAC thanked Ann Overstreet for holding the 2018 Bike Meet and Greet and initiated a discussion of things that went well and others to improve upon. One GABAC suggestion was to promote the event earlier to increase attendance. Another suggestion was to hold the event at a more centrally located location. Some suggested locations included NM Expo and a centrally located Community Center. Another suggestion was to hold the meeting in conjunction with a happy hour to increase the social aspect of the event.

Ann Overstreet asked if the exhibit tables were helpful, which many believed them to be. A member of the public suggested that a slide show of the past year's bicycle accomplishments be shown at the event.

- **311 Report Process**

Scot Key invited John Fleck to discuss his experience with the 311 system. Mr. Fleck stated he has attempted use of the 311 system many times, but has experienced limited success of his concerns being addressed. One of Mr. Fleck's primary complaints was with 311 functioning like a screening mechanism and the difficulty in receiving feedback from the City.

Hugh Hulse and Jason Coffey stated that to increase the likelihood a City response, the 311 user should provide their contact info and not submit the 311 as anonymous. Mr. Coffey stated that 311 for Parks and Rec can be more complicated because 311 is address based and many Parks and Rec facilities do not follow the same addressing convention. Mr. Coffey and a member of the public stated the 311 app might be a better avenue for lodging complaints. Mr. Coffey stated the 311 app and standard phone 311 complaint create slightly different information trails.

Andrew Varoz stated that DMD takes 311 submissions seriously and suggested that users provide their contact info and specifically request a call back as part of the 311 submittal.

- **Changes in COA Administration and Impact on Bike Safety/Infrastructure**

Scot Key is curious what GABAC should do, if anything, to introduce themselves to the new Administration (Mayor, Traffic Engineer, etc.). Dan Majewski suggested GABAC write a letter to the Administration offering GABAC's assistance with an invitation to future GABAC meetings.

- **Staff Reports**

- **DMD Engineering**

Debbie Bauman provided the written DMD Engineering Report (see attached) in advance of the meeting. Eric Froberg led a discussion of the report and GABAC was appreciative of Ms. Bauman's efforts.

- Paradise Update

Eric Froberg stated that the project is currently at the 90% stage and is awaiting right of way acquisition. Mr. Froberg stated the proposed cross section (see attached) was included as part of the DMD Engineering staff report.

Scot Key asked how the proposed cross section would adhere to the updated DPM requirements. Mr. Varoz, could not speak directly to the Paradise project, but reminded GABAC that the DPM provides recommendations and that individual projects are developed based on several criteria.

### **DPM Update**

Eric Froberg stated that the Technical Review Committee was working on the remaining sections, but should be completed in the next couple of months, with the Executive Committee approving the drafts presented by the Technical Review Committee. Mr. Froberg was not sure of the steps or approval process beyond the Executive Committee. Mr. Froberg stated the DPM update was a large undertaking for the City and is nearing competing.

### **El Pueblo Update**

Eric Froberg stated the City and NMDOT are still discussing the details of the El Pueblo Road/Channel Road intersection. Once the funding and limits of responsibility were determined, the project could then move forward with an update provided to GABAC.

### **North I-25 Bicycle Accessibility Study**

Eric Froberg stated the initial data collection had been completed with the next step being to convene a project working group. Mr. Froberg inquired if Scot Key was still planning to be the GABAC representative. Mr. Key stated he would be willing to relinquish his seat if another GABAC member was interested.

### **Status of Vacancies**

Eric Froberg indicated the M-15 position had been advertised and applications are currently under review.

### **Council Services**

No Report.

### **Parks and Recreation (P&R)**

Jason Coffey provided a written summary (attached) in advance of the meeting. Mr. Coffey highlighted the following:

- Trail Counts
  - P&R prefers to not release any data until the data collection was complete in an effort to not undermine the credibility of the non-motorized count program.
- Trail Planner position was closed on 1/31/18 and applications are currently under review.
- Four Hill Trail
  - Jim Fordice inquired about this project. Jason Coffey provided a general location and stated this was a paving maintenance project what would be delayed until the temperatures were adequate.
- Bridge and Trail Evaluation Study
  - Scot Key asked if GABAC had seen the final deliverable. Jason Coffey stated the evaluations were complete and a list of the “Top 5” could be shared with GABAC.
- South Diversion Channel Trail Update
  - Scot Key inquired about any future plans along the South Diversion Channel. Jason Coffey stated the South Diversion Channel Trail was a part of the 2040 long range planning documents and was included on the Bike and Trail Facility Plan. Mr. Key would like to see the South Diversion Channel Trail move forward.

Julie Luna provided a handout and list (see attached) of the County's Complete Streets projects. Ms. Luna led a brief discussion of the project list.

### **MRCOG**

Valerie Hermanson stated that MRCOG and the City met to provide concurrence of the NEAR SOUTH VALLEY MULTIMODAL STUDY. Overall approval of the report was expected in the next couple of weeks and would then be available through the MRCOG website.

Valerie Hermanson announced the Center for Disease Control provided a grant to MRCOG to allow for attendance at the Walkability Action Institute Conference/Training in Atlanta.

Valerie Hermanson stated the MRCOG Bike Share program was moving forward with an anticipated March 2018 launch.

### **Discussion/Action Item(s)**

#### **Election of Chair and Vice-Chair**

Ed Gerety continued a discussion from previous GABAC meetings regarding the statutory requirements for GABAC to have a Chair /Vice Chair and to produce an Annual Report.

Mr. Gerety made a motion for continued discussion and nominations. A second to the motion was not forthcoming, so Mr. Froberg asked if there was a second to the motion. The second to the motion did not materialize so the motion fell to the floor and did not come before the group. Mr. Gerety asked that the topic remain on the agenda for future discussion.

#### **OMA Processes and Information Infrastructure**

Ed Gerety initiated a discussion of the Open Meetings Act (OMA) and his desire for more thorough collaboration between GABAC members outside of the regularly scheduled monthly GABAC meetings. Mr. Gerety would like to have City email addresses, an online public forum for discussion purposes with review capabilities by the public, etc.

Moises Gonzalez stated that no other City committee had that type of set up and that New Mexico state law would likely prohibit that type of functionality based on public notice requirements.

Ed Gerety stated he would do additional research and report back at a future GABAC meeting.

#### **General Announcement**

Dan Majewski stated there were still vacancies on the GABAC committee and encouraged others to volunteer.



## GABAC Staff Report

Debbie Bauman, Planning and Programming Manager, Engineering Division

- **Paradise Update:**
  - The limits of the Paradise Blvd Improvements project (CPN 648092) are from just west of the Golf Course Road intersection and the western limit of the intersection at Eagle Ranch Road. The purpose of the project is to provide multimodal facilities through the corridor. Included in the improvements are four lanes for vehicular travel (two 10.5" lanes in each direction), 4' on street bike lanes with a 2' striped buffer, 12' multiuse trail on the south side, 6' sidewalk on the north side, increased lighting, landscaping, and minor storm drainage and traffic operation improvements including a second right turn lane EB to SB Eagle Ranch Road.
  - We have been at a pre-90% design since we first presented the project to GABAC due to right-of-way acquisition. Plans have not changed since they were last presented to the Committee. Construction is scheduled for August of this year. The proposed typical section is attached to this report.
  
- **DPM Update:**
  - Several sections are still being revised by the technical review committee. The Executive Committee is still in the review process of several other sections, however, the final update of the DPM is expected to be completed during summer 2018
  
- **El Pueblo Update:**
  - COA Engineering is working with NMDOT to develop an approach to design and implement both the remaining trail segment from Paseo to the North Diversion Channel and the proposed future intersection of El Pueblo and Channel Road. Discussions with NMDOT District 3 are on-going. Once the agencies roles and responsibilities, and funding have been identified another update will be provided to the Committee.
  
- **North I-25 Bicycle Accessibility Study**
  - Initial data gathering has been completed. Next step is to meet with the working group. Anticipated first meeting end of February.
  
- **Status of Vacancies:**
  - The M-15 Planner position in Engineering has been advertised. Applications are being reviewed by HR and interviews will be set up after HR review

At the January 16, 2018 GARTC meeting the committee discussed potential changes to the Bike Map and then sent those suggestions to the DMD project manager. GARTC is interested in providing better trail information to the public and is exploring options for how to accomplish that goal. One idea is just to add "Trail" to the title of the map so people know that it also contains trail information. Also, GARTC continues to seek new members to fill the vacant seats and to replace some of the members whose terms have expired. If you know anyone who is passionate about trails and has the time and energy for GARTC please have them apply online or contact me if they have question about the committee.


- **The North Diversion Channel Trail Bridge Deck (just south of Osuna)**-I received the estimate Friday afternoon (2/9) but have not had time to review it yet. Once we have reviewed the cost estimate we will move forward with a work order. The contractor said they wouldn't want to start construction on this until March in any case due to temperature concerns relating to the light-weight concrete needed, so we are still a ways out from any construction.
- **Gail Ryba Memorial Bridge Slope Stabilization**- The gabions are complete and work is beginning on the wire-tied rip rap mattress that will further stabilize the slope. The slope will be hydro-seeded in spring.
- **Four Hill Trail**-This project is on hold until March or the 24 hour temperature is 50 degrees. The seal coat product the contractor uses has specifications requiring that temperature range, so once we get to those temps we will proceed with this project.
- **Ladera Dam Trail**-Parks has requested a cost estimate to renovate the trail around Ladera Golf Course, parallel to Ladera Dr NW. The Councilor's office and the neighborhood have been pushing for this to improve the trail and to match the newly rebuilt roadway and medians on Ladera Dr NW. The trail does need renovation but a lengthy coordination period has been needed with AMAFCA because the trail sits on top of a dam. We were able to get the survey information we needed from AMAFCA and are now waiting for a cost estimate from our on-call contractor to see how best to proceed.
- **Trail Counts**-I have received a couple requests for trail count numbers from GABAC members and I realized that I may have provided some misleading information regarding the counts. I said, we might be able to release a teaser of some preliminary count numbers but that is not the case. The reason is that getting a credible non-motorized count program launched requires a measured approach. Data is routinely cherry picked and therefore we must have only one data set available for use. Parks is working with MRCOG to support the development of a non-motorized count program. The 5 trail counters installed last October are part of that effort. A considerable level of effort is required to develop a non-motorized count program and funding and staffing are key elements, both of which are being worked on but take time to pan out. We don't want to undermine the credibility of the non-motorized count program by letting the data trickle out. The data sets need to be developed carefully and released to everyone at the same time so we can all be using the same data sets for whatever purposes we going to use them for. 
