Items left in vehicles that were burglarized this weekend: Back pack. Vehicle insurance and registration paperwork. Beats headphones and a gym bag. Wallet, IDs, credit cards, contractor's license and \$1.00 in cash. Designer handbag, wallet, IDs and \$100 cash. Toys worth \$100. Vehicle battery.

Quick Take-Aways: It's astounding the number of high dollar items and identification/personal information being left in unattended vehicles. It's also astounding that half of the auto burglaries committed this weekend were to vehicles left unlocked with valuable inside that were stolen. Crime Prevention is about controlling your environment to reduce your odds of being a victim – lock up and remove items from your vehicle when you park and walk away. The trail head auto burglaries all noted victims were only gone an hour, yet leaving Coach handbags, wallets, IDs, credit cards, cash, professional documents inside these vehicles attracted thieves. I recommend you pare down to the essentials and for a hike/jog/dog walk/mountain bike ride leave nothing with personal information or value inside the vehicle and carry it with you.
