<u>Trending Tuesday</u>: The APD Crime Analysis Unit reports that **APD took 139 auto burglary reports the week of October 8 – 14**. The numbers among the 6 APD Area Commands ranged from a low of 13 auto burglaries (South West Area Command) to a high of 37 auto burglaries (North East Area Command) for the week. The **Foothills Area Command logged 22 auto burglary** reports for that 7-day period.

<u>Hot Wheels Report</u>: APD Crime Analysis reports that there were **69 auto theft reports taken the week of October 8-14 city-wide**. The numbers ranged from a high of **16 stolen vehicles reported (South East Area Command) to a low of 6 stolen vehicles reported (Foothills Area Command)**. Although the Foothills had the lowest number of auto theft reports taken for that 7-day period city-wide, with winter approaching and this week's cold weather, please remember to lock up and **avoid "warm up" auto thefts** (leaving the vehicle running and unattended). Every winter APD sees about 100 "warm up" auto thefts – <u>*a 100% preventable crime!*</u> The trend continues downward too; Crime Analysis reported 96 stolen vehicles for Albuquerque the week of 9/24-9/30 and 93 the week of 10/1-10/7. Hondas were popular vehicles to steal over the past week; 11 reported stolen across the city (4 of 11 were Civics). Chevrolets proved to be popular vehicles to steal (9, and 4 of 9 were pick ups) and 8 Fords (6 of 8 were pick ups). Hot areas to steal wheels for the prior 7 days were apartments (28 cases) and for the Foothills, **all of our stolen vehicles were taken from Foothills apartment complexes.** Single family residential neighborhoods across the city experienced 22 stolen vehicles for those 7 days and then a big drop to 4 vehicles stolen from hotels, 3 from car dealerships/mechanics and businesses.
