Skiing or Snowboarding-2009

What: Learn to ski or snowboard. This three session adventure will include adult supervision, transportation, lessons, a half day for a full day lift ticket, and equipment. Bring your own lunch or money for lunch. Your Parks & Recreation department is teaming up with NMX and local equipment companies to offer this affordable way to learn to ski or snowboard.



Who: This adventure is available to youth from 12 years of age to 18 years, on the day of the adventure. Spots are available on a first come, first served basis.

Cost: This three session “learn to” adventure will cost **\$180.00** per guest and includes everything mentioned above.

When: The dates are

January- Saturday 10, 17 & 24 2009,- Girls Only Adventure

January- Sunday 11, 18, & 25 2009

February Saturday 7, 21 & 28, Sunday 8, 22 & March 1 2009

March Saturday 7, 14 & 21, Sunday 8, 15 & 22 2009 (if there is snow)

Each Saturday or Sunday for each month is a full set of lessons and the student must attend all three lessons to really enjoy the adventure and learn the sport.

Ski Helmets are required.

How: Pre-registration is required. You can register at the Parks and Recreation Administration Building. For more information or to sign up log onto www.cabq.gov/recreation or call us at 768-5328. All your City questions can be answered by calling 311, in the Albuquerque area.

Where: This adventure will go to Sipapu (Saturdays) or Los Alamos –Pajarito (Sundays). The youth will meet at the Parks and Recreation Administration Building around 6:00 AM [exact times will be detailed at registration]. We will return at approximately 6:00 PM.

Directions to Parks and Recreation Administration Building: From I-40, exit 6th Street, go SOUTH. Turn left on Haines, then right on 4th. Drive SOUTH on 4th Street, past the railroad tracks. Turn RIGHT into the driveway just past the black wrought iron fence, before the City of Albuquerque gas pumps. If you drive past Aspen Street, you have gone too far. The Parks and Recreation Administration Building is a one-story, sand-colored, brick building with a large, two-story mural, and is on the west side of Fourth Street.
