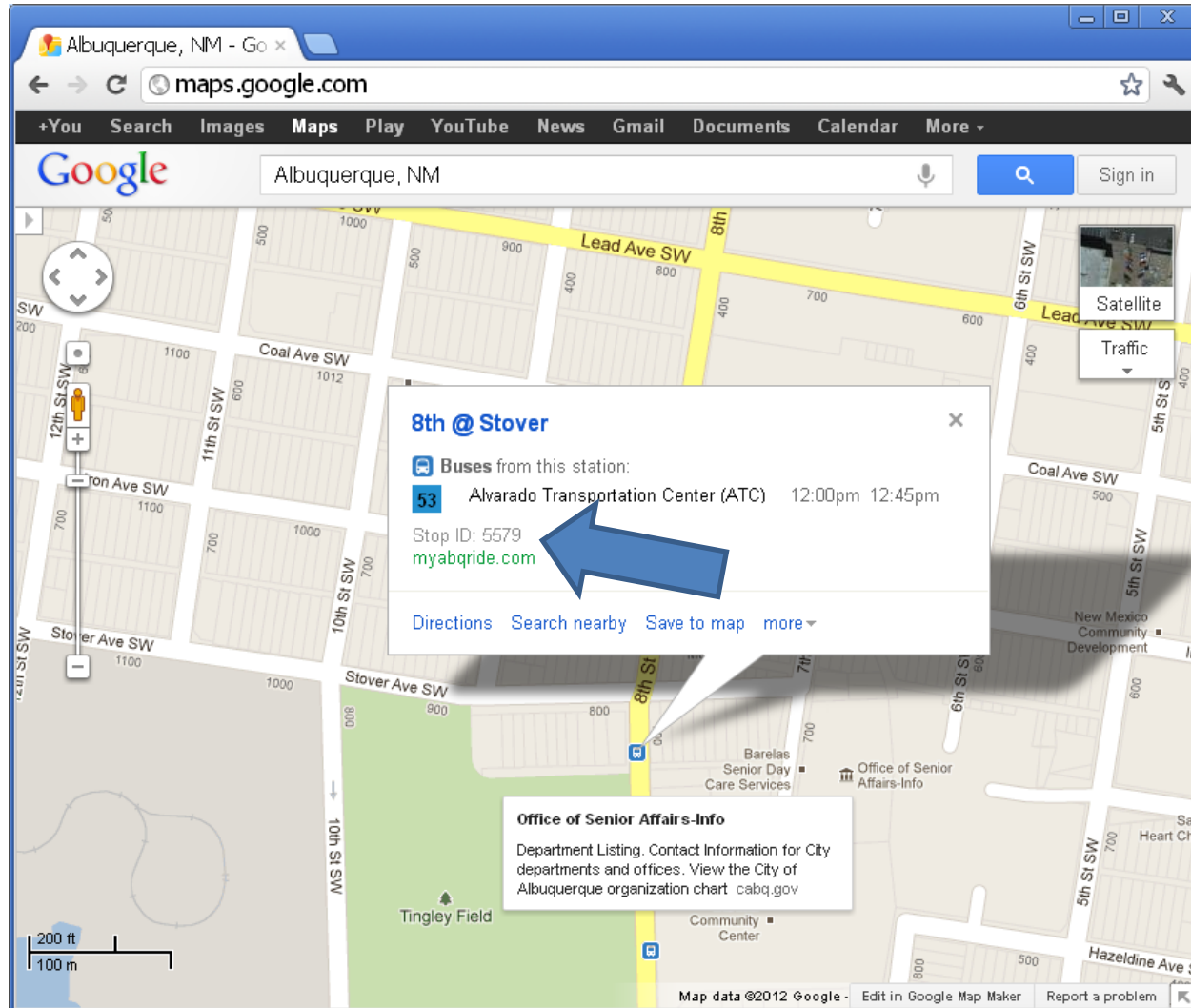
It's as easy as 1 - 2 - 3

- Last, Click on the "Get Trip Plan" and get ready to ride.

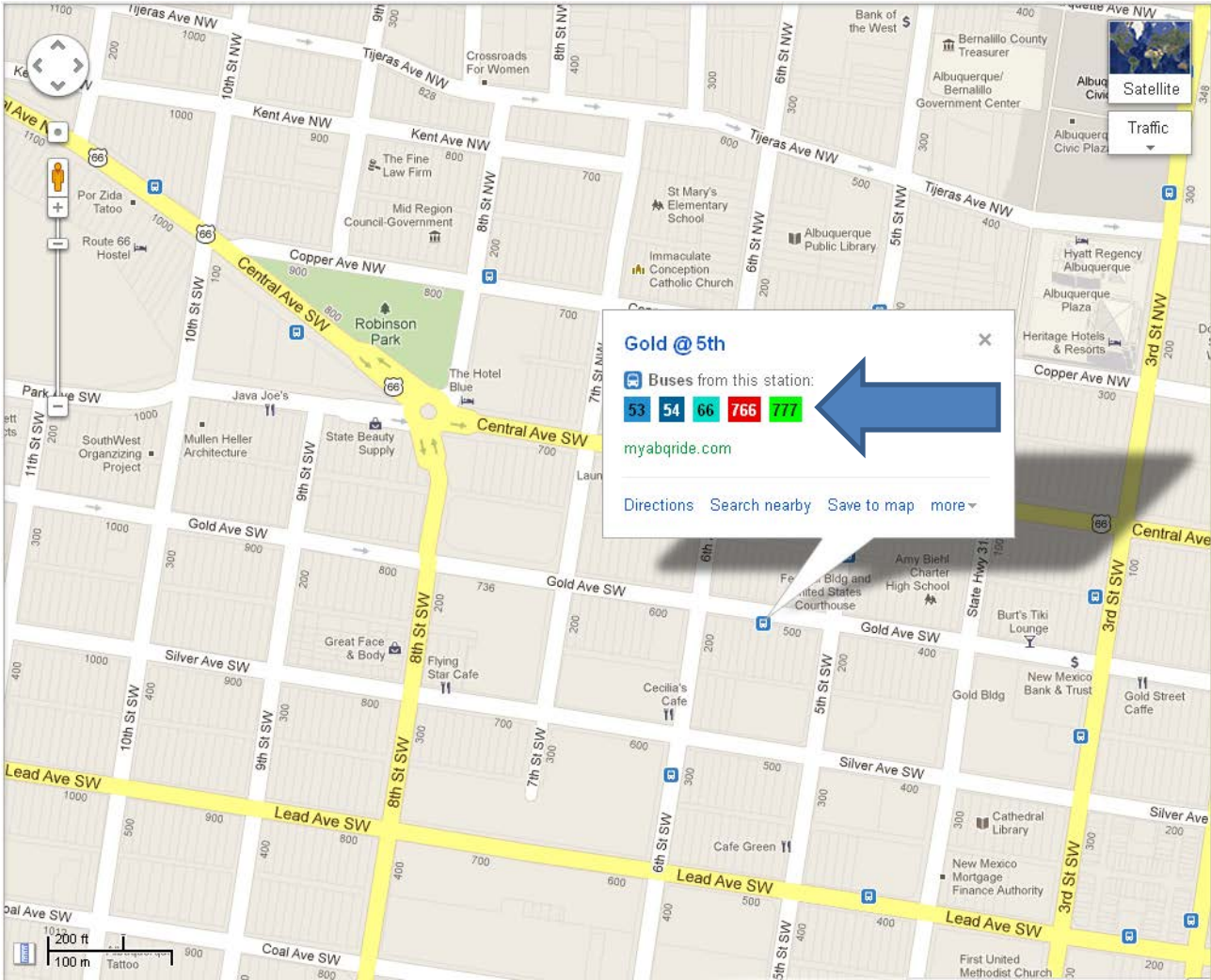

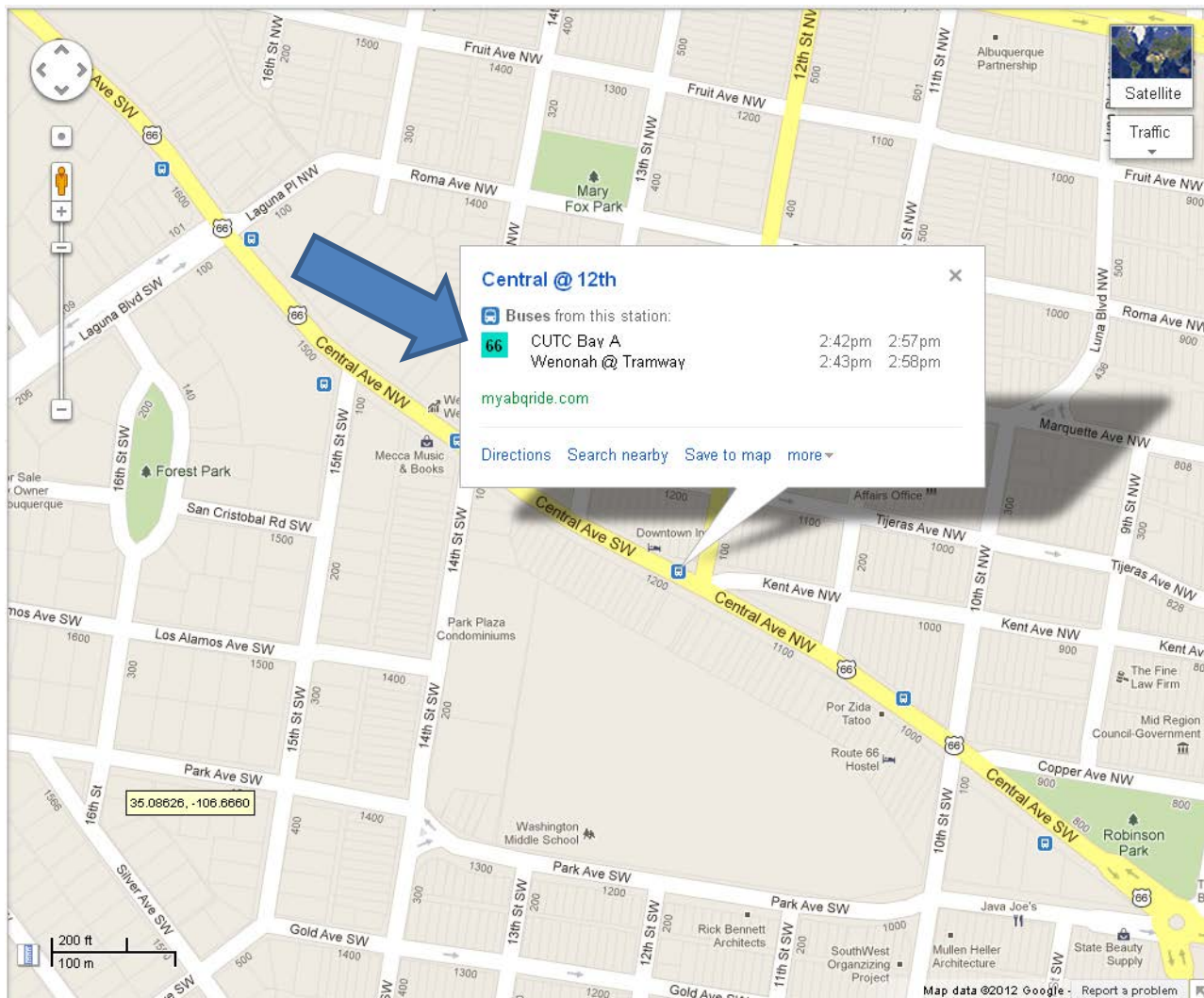
2. Google Maps – zoom in to see bus stops; click on the bus stop icon

Google Maps App for iPhones and Android Mobile Devices

- The default Google Maps Mobile Application that comes with iPhones and Android phones does not have the same functionality as Google Maps on the web.
- Clicking on a bus stop on the Mobile App will reveal schedule data, but not bus STOP numbers.
