



### YTD IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS



#### **MAJOR RESPONSE ACTIVITIES**

- CORA partnered with the Albuquerque Police Department's Proactive Response Teams to conduct outreach, offering resources and support to the impacted community following 7 homicides.
- Following the tragic loss of four Bernalillo County first responders, CORA attended a gathering speaking with several members of the community offering support and resources for grief and trauma.
- CORA conducted outreach for a total of 14 gun violence incidents for the month of July. During outreach, CORA offered support connecting victims to resources.
- CORA assisted a family who was displaced following a SWAT call with food, shelter, and clean-up.

### PROACTIVE AND ONGOING COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT ACTIVITIES

- At the request of a community leader in our refugee community, CORA met with him to see how ACS can help support his community. CORA is still collaborating with this leader on what that looks like.
- CORA is a proud member of the Gun Violence Prevention and Intervention Task Force and serves on three of its committees.
