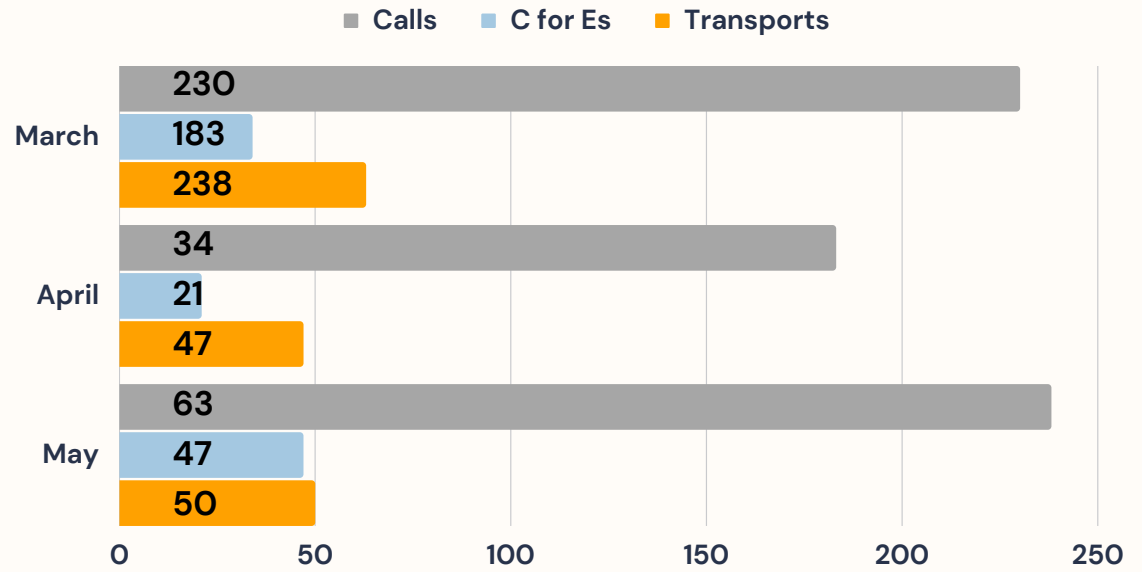

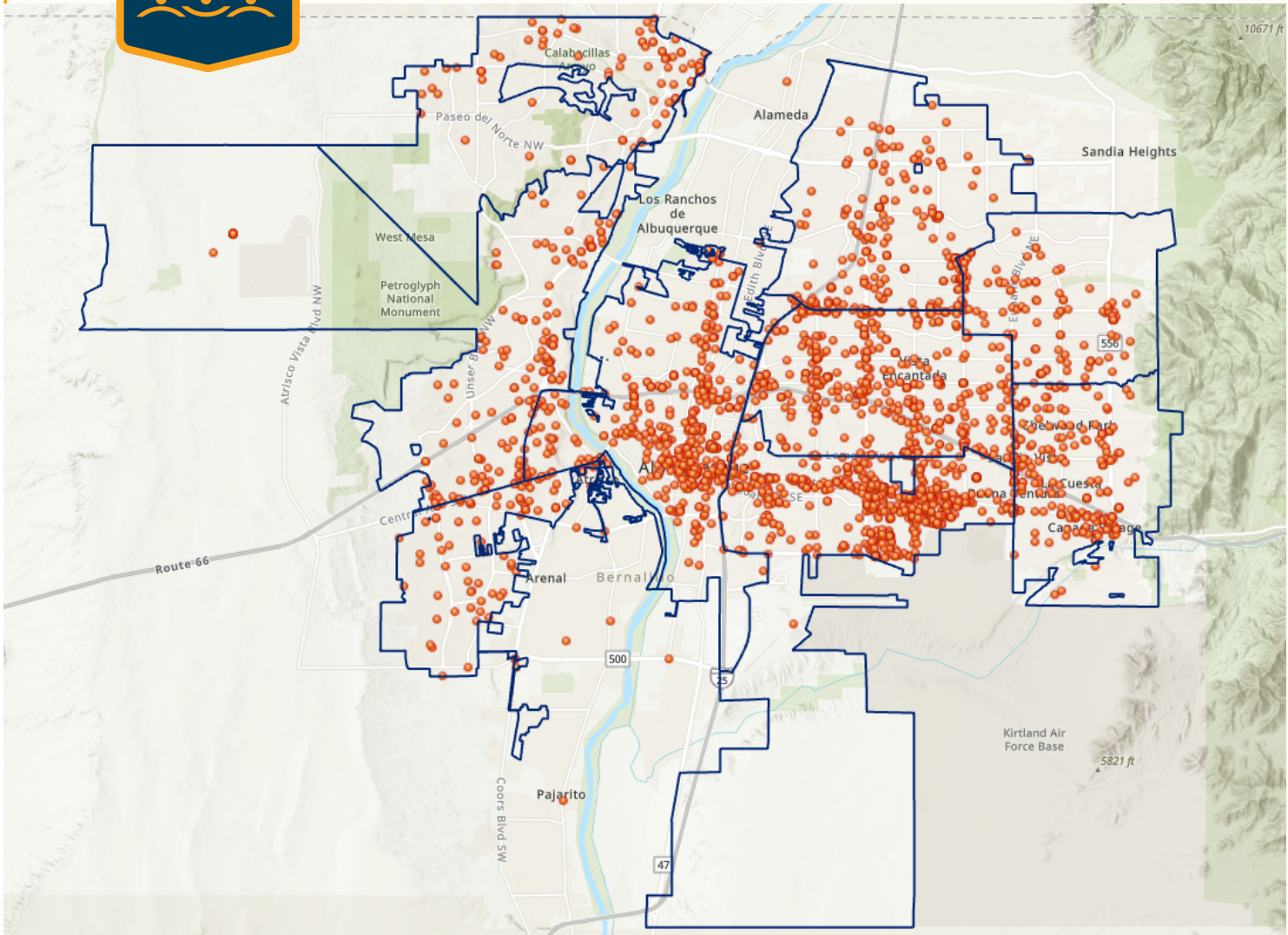


MCT CALLS, CERTIFICATES FOR EVALUATION, AND TRANSPORTS\*

SIGNIFICANT RESPONSE ACTIVITIES

- The Community-Oriented Response and Assistance Program is working with a family who recently became unsheltered. CORA Responders connected the mother and her 2 young children to the Hawthorne Suites. CORA also connected her adult son to the Violence Intervention Program. Two days later, Responders made accommodations for the Grandmother and her small dog at the Gateway center.
- In May, CORA connected the family of teen sexual assault victim to the Crime Victims Resource Center, where they received relocation funds.
- In May, CORA connected a sex trafficking victim to the Rape Crisis Center. The client received a check to move into a new apartment at the end of the month.
- CORA worked with the family of a person found deceased in an apartment by Albuquerque Police. The apartment complex was refusing to allow the family inside to retrieve the person's items. CORA Responders worked with the apartment complex and APD to help family gain access to the apartment. The family was thankful for CORA's assistance.

PROACTIVE AND ONGOING COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES

- CORA hosted a community event on May 3rd for a senior community impacted by a homicide. For this event CORA coordinated with Senior Affairs, Adult Protective Services and APD to provide a holistic approach to the community's needs.
- On May 8th, CORA attended the Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Commission Monthly Meeting.
