The largest demographics categories in shootings with injuries are: males $85 \%$, Hispanic $50 \%$, and subject in the 18-34 age group. African Americans are close to 3 times over-represented in both the victim and offender populations

This age category differs from homicide statistics, which had a high population in the 18-44 age range.

Similar to homicide statistics, shootings with injury in 2019 had over 37\% of offenders in the 18-24 age category. This is very significant since this is the smallest age range of the categories, and the smallest percent of the 2019 Albuquerque population.

To date, $25.4 \%$ of all Candidates we have delivered custom notifications to have requested and been referred to services. $19.5 \%$ of clients age 18-35 who received a custom notification requested and were referred to services. $22 \%$ of all male candidates who received a custom notification requested and were referred to services. $30 \%$ of all female candidates who received a custom notification requested and were referred to services.


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
