Governing Statutory & Regulatory Provisions

- National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS), in Clean Air Act
- NAAQS reviewed every five years
- Submit "Infrastructure SIP" (iSIP) within 3 years of promulgation of new NAAQS
- iSIP demonstrates ability & authority to implement, maintain, and enforce new NAAQS

Governing Statutory & Regulatory Provisions

- Legally required elements of iSIP:
 - Enforceable emission limits/control measures
 - Air quality monitoring & modeling
 - Permitting program
 - Emissions reporting
 - Adequate funding & personnel
 - State law authority to implement NAAQS
 - Emergency powers; fee collection
 - Other elements as well

Regulatory Background

- EPA issued new SO₂ NAAQS, June 2010
- New standard: more stringent
 - One hour (versus 24 hours & one year)
 - 75 parts per billion (versus per million)
 - Precise formulation & calculation method

Meeting the new standard

- Ambient air monitoring of SO₂ underway in Bernalillo County since 2010 (NCore program)
- 2014 SO₂ levels: less than 10% of the NAAQS
- EPA "attainment" designation?

Regulatory Background

SO₂ iSIP was due June 2013

- EPA has requested we make this a priority
- Air Board approval necessary

Substance of Draft iSIP

- Public Review Draft demonstrates how Abq-BernCo meets 2010 SO₂ NAAQS
- iSIP proposes no new regulations or requirements
- No adverse impact of iSIP on citizens or businesses

Request

- Hearing before Albuquerque-Bernalillo County Air Quality Control Board:
 - Adopt SO₂ iSIP
 - Submit adopted iSIP to EPA as proposed revision to New Mexico State Implementation Plan
- Provide a court reporter & hearing officer

Authority

- New Mexico Air Quality Control Act, NMSA 1978, Sections 74-2-4 and 74-2-5.B(1)
- Authorizes and requires the Board to:
 - · adopt, amend, or replace air quality regulations
 - adopt air quality plans (SIPs)
- See also:
 - City of Abq Ordinances, Section 9-5-1-4(B)
 - Bernalillo County Ordinances, Section 30-33(b)
