



Monitoring Air Quality Since 1958








City of Albuquerque/Bernalillo County Criteria Pollutant Design Values as a Percentage of the National Ambient Air Quality Standards for Year 2015



Ozone Precursor - NOx




Ozone Precursor - VOC

Monitoring

Accomplishments

- Incorporated high particulate matter (PM) alert email system to notify staff of elevated dust and smoke levels at/near air monitoring stations (Hourly)
- Installation of web-cameras at all air monitoring stations and at City Hall to provide real time visualization of dust and smoke events

- Adding new PM10 & PM2.5 monitoring equipment to South Valley and Jefferson Stations (Minute data)
- Evaluating mobile monitoring options
- Conducting particulate matter speciation





Dear Neighborhood Association/Coalition Representatives,

Why did I receive this public notice?

You are a designated representative of a recognized neighborhood association or neighborhood coalition within one-half mile of the facility listed in an air quality permit application. The enclosed Public Notice is scheduled for publication in the Albuquerque Journal on December 13, 2016.

What is the Air Quality Permit application review process?

The City of Albuquerque, Environmental Health Department, Air Quality Program (Program) is responsible for the review and issuance of Air Quality Permits for any stationary source of air contaminants within Bernalillo County. The Program reviews each application and rules it either complete or incomplete. Complete applications go through a 30-day public comment period. The Program will hold a Public Information Hearing only if the Director determines there is significant public interest and a significant air quality issue is involved.



Summary	The application is to construct a 480 horsepower (hp), EPA Tier 3 emission certified, diesel-fired internal combustion engine coupled to a 300 kW emergency electrical generator. The purpose of the unit is to provide emergency backup electrical power in the case of the unavoidable loss of commercial power.
