Thank you for your comments in regards to the Air Quality Division's (AQD) proposed amendments to the Albuquerque-Bernalillo County Air Quality Control Board *Open Burning* regulation, 20.11.21 NMAC.

In regards to your first question: "What is the basis for offering to restrict the term of burn permits from one year to a month?"

The current open burning regulation doesn't specify any restriction on time-frame for either single or multiple event burn permits. It can be difficult to get all the necessary people and resources together when the weather is right to do a burn safely. The flexibility offered by a time-frame allows people to make wise choices regarding weather, staffing, and equipment. Therefore AQD gives burners such a time-frame. In regards to single-event permits, AQD has been writing in one month of backup dates for the burn. For multiple-event permits, AQD gives a range of dates up to a year. AQD developed one-month and one-year time frames as reasonable amounts of time to allow a permit to remain "open", and the current regulation is silent on how long the permits should be valid for. In addition, the proposed language allows for a customized time-frame to be incorporated into the permit (see 20.11.21.13.G NMAC). If you have an alternate time-frame to propose, we would be interested in discussing it.

In regards to your second question: "What method(s) are contemplated in ensuring that the proposed set of rules & regulations are conveyed to the constituents that will now be required to adhere to the proposed regulations?"

The AQD has attempted to inform the affected community in the following ways.

1. Contact stakeholders to make them aware of the proposed changes. Stakeholders include: individuals who currently hold an open burn permit; the Bernalillo County Fire Department; the Albuquerque Fire Department; Bernalillo County Neighborhood Associations; Albuquerque Neighborhood Associations etc.

2. Publish legal advertisements in the Albuquerque Journal and the New Mexico Register.

3. Post notices on the AQD website, and send e-mail notice to list serve of those interested in either the Air Quality Control Board or those interested in receiving the 'No-Burn' forecast.

4. Once rule is adopted, the open burn program, the small business assistance program, and the enforcement program will work to bring users of open burning in Bernalillo County into compliance.

As mentioned in our previous letter on January 27, 2011, the hearing on proposed amendments to 20.11.21 NMAC is scheduled for March 9, 2011. Hearings and meetings of the Air Board are open to the public and all interested persons are encouraged to participate. All persons who wish to testify regarding the subject of the hearing may do so at the hearing and will be given a reasonable opportunity to submit relevant evidence, data, views and arguments, orally or in writing, to introduce exhibits and to examine witnesses in accordance with the Joint Air Quality Control Board Ordinances, Section 9-5-1-6 ROA 1994 and Bernalillo County Ordinance 94-5, Section 6. Therefore, if you wish to propose any modification the AQD's Public Review Draft, you may testify at this hearing.
