Transportation Conformity Rule

- Clean Air Act requirement
- Ensures that federally-funded highway and transit projects "conform to" the SIP
- Ensures that public health is protected
 - Early consideration of the air-quality impacts of transportation decisions
 - Non-attainment & Re-Attainment areas

Transportation Conformity Rule PM_{2.5} & PM₁₀ Amendments

- March 24, 2010, EPA promulgated changes to the transportation conformity rule effective April 23, 2010
- Affects PM₁₀ and PM_{2.5} nonattainment and maintenance areas.
- Update required to comply with federal law

- Implement transportation conformity under 2006 PM_{2.5} NAAQS
- Applies to 2006 PM_{2.5} nonattainment areas on December 14, 2010

- Requirements for demonstrating conformity for the 2006 PM2.5 NAAQS
 - Regional emissions test(s) that would apply before and after SIP motor vehicle emissions budgets are established for the revised NAAQS

 Updates the baseline year for the interim emissions test to calendar year 2008 in 2006 PM_{2.5} nonattainment areas

 Clarifies application of PM₁₀ budgets, now that the annual PM₁₀ standard has been revoked

- Federally funded/approved highway and transit projects in PM_{2.5}, PM₁₀ and Carbon Monoxide nonattainment and maintenance areas must not delay timely attainment or achievement of other interim milestones
- Bernalillo County is in attainment for PM_{2.5} and PM₁₀, and is in attainment under a Maintenance Plan for CO.

 Requires new PM_{2.5} nonattainment areas and existing PM₁₀ nonattainment and maintenance areas to use conformity tests that ensure that air quality is protected in areas that need to attain or maintain NAAQS

 Hot-spot analyses are performed in a manner consistent with the CAA public health and environmental requirements

Petition To Amend Transportation Conformity

- Amend 20.11.3 NMAC, Transportation
 Conformity, and incorporate an amended
 20.11.3 NMAC into the SIP
 - Request for a hearing
 - Court reporter
 - Hearing officer

Petition To Amend Transportation Conformity

Authority

- New Mexico Air Quality Control Act
 - authorizes and requires the Air Board to adopt, amend, or replace air quality regulations and to adopt air quality plans (SIPs)
