EHD Air Quality Program 2021 Goals 1.21.21

Permitting Division: Complete processing of the outstanding Title V permit applications:

1. City of Albuquerque Cerro Colorado Landfill
2. Public Service Company of New Mexico Rio Bravo Generating Station
3. Kirtland Air Force Base

Enforcement & Compliance Division: Establish tracking mechanism in EnvisionConnect for permittees' assigned inspector, reports, compliance testing, monthly reports, quarterly reports, semi- and annual reporting as well as status.

Monitoring Division:

1. Install and launch hazardous air pollutants (HAPS) ambient air monitoring
2. Install and launch photochemical assessment monitoring (PAMS) ambient air monitoring at NCore Multipollutant Monitoring Network site

Vehicle Pollution Management Division:

1. Make progress on updating Part 100, including updating the Motor Vehicle Emissions Control City Ordinance
2. Submit the 2020 National Emissions Inventory Data for Bernalillo County to EPA due December 31, 2021 (due every 3-years)

Control Strategies:

1. Prioritize local, outdated air quality regulations for the regulatory development process for presentation to the Board
2. Implement Ozone Initiative, including Ozone Advance program to address local ozone issues
3. Meet State Implementation Plan deadlines as soon as possible

Communication & Outreach:

1. Complete major website update
2. Initiate a county-wide listening and outreach effort, including development of a comprehensive stakeholder database, consistent and accessible AQP informational materials, attendance at existing neighborhood and other organization meetings, and summary documentation and analysis for recommendations to mitigate challenges between the Department and residents
3. Develop a Public Involvement Handbook to provide clear guidance to the regulated community about the Department's requirements and expectations for public involvement
