



May 11 – October 13


LOCALLY CURATED

Opening February 2019
Karl Hofmann – known for his lyrical use of mundane materials deployed in futuristic, abstract installations that activate space in exciting ways – will transform the Museum's expansive lobby with his most ambitious effort yet.



Seed: Climate Change Resilience
June 22 – September 29
Inspired dialogue around global warming, local food, healthy communities, and the revitalization of bioregional indigenous agricultural practices.



Dreams Unreal: Psychedelic Concert Posters, 1966-1970
December 2019 – April 2020
In the late 1960s, San Francisco was ground zero for an unprecedented social revolution. Artists created a new genre in the process: the collectible rock concert poster.

Pesos and Patriots
January 26 – May 19, 2019
The story of New Mexico's Role in the American War of Independence and the Albuquerque families who supported the American cause.



Courage and Compassion
June 1 – November 3
This exhibition explores the shared story of the Japanese American World War II experience and the impact World War II-era internment camps had on New Mexicans.



Tonque Pueblo Potters
December 2019 – May 2020
Explore the pottery traditions of the ancestral village of Tonque Pueblo through oral histories, historic documents, and the voices of contemporary Pueblo potters and scholars.

A bold installation of Albuquerque Museum's permanent collection emphasizes real New Mexico. Drawn from the Museum's permanent collection of almost 10,000 works of art, Common Ground includes masterworks by artists including Georgia O'Keeffe, Ernest Blumenschein, Raymond Jonson, Fritz Scholder, Luis Jimenez, Jaune Quick-to-See Smith, and Diego Romero.

Spirited. Courageous. Resourceful. Innovative. An interactive, engaging, fun-filled presentation of the history and culture of the central Rio Grande Valley. Hundreds of our city's most beloved artifacts are featured including artifacts from the Alvarado Hotel, Route 66 signage, and the 1665 Repostero made for the eighth Duke of Albuquerque, Francisco Fernández de la Cueva.
