# 2020 Museum School Summer Classes

# What to Expect

The Museum will be following the State of New Mexico's guidelines for Summer Youth Programs. Please read the information below so you are aware of the modifications to this year's program.

### Classes will be held outdoors.

To minimize interactions with the general public and maximize ventilation, the Museum has created an air-conditioned outdoor classroom in our back sculpture garden. Due the time spent outdoors, these classes are not recommended for children with asthma or severe allergies to dust or pollen.

### Classes will be small and adhere to social distancing guidelines.

Classes will have no more than 5 students at this time. Each child will have their own table and will be spaced at least 6 feet from one another.

#### Your child will need to wear a mask at all times.

In accordance with New Mexico's health order to wear masks in public, unless exercising, drinking or eating, your child will be required to wear a mask during the duration of the class, a daily total of two and half hours. We encourage practicing this at home so that children will become familiar with this practice by the time class has started. You will need to provide your child with a mask to participate.

### Curbside pick-up and drop of will be required.

To limit exposure, a Museum staff member will greet and escort your child during drop off and pick up. Those picking up the child from class will need to be on the approved list. Pick up and drop off will take place at the south dock of the Museum (see map below).

#### Daily temperature tests and wellness checks will be conducted at check in.

Upon arrival, a daily temperature will be taken curbside by a Museum staff member. Children with temperature readings of 100.4 or above will not be admitted to the program. In addition, a wellness check will be conducted daily. Students who are exhibiting symptoms or have been exposed to someone diagnosed or exhibiting symptoms of COVID 19 will not be admitted to the program.

### **Sick Policy**

The Museum requests that you protect the health of our staff, students and your child by not bringing them to the Museum when they are sick.

Of special consideration are the following:

- Is feverish or has had a fever within the last 24 hours (100.4)
- Coughs continuously
- Has vomited or had diarrhea within 24 hours
- Has pink eye or symptoms which might be pink eye (conjunctivitis)
- Had developed a runny nose that is cloudy/not clear
- Has been on antibiotics for less than 24 hours
- Has symptoms of any contagious diseases or infections (ringworm, crusted or oozing lesions, chicken pox, etc.)
- Has an undiagnosed rash

You will be called to pick up your child at the center if your child shows any of the symptoms listed above.

### Additional personal items we recommend.

To limit the sharing of common items we recommend that you send the following items with your child. Hand sanitizer or wipes, tissue, water and pencils. Also, since there may be some exposure to sun during breaks or walks in the sculpture garden, we also recommended sunscreen, sunglasses and a hat.
