









## **How 1% Works**

The City of Albuquerque's Public Art Program was started in 1978, with the passage of the Art in Municipal Places Ordinance. The bold initiative, one of the earliest in the country, guarantees that 1% of voter-approved general obligation bonds and certain revenue bonds will be set aside for the commission or purchase of art for public spaces. In 1982 the Bernalillo County Commission adopted its own percent for art Ordinance providing public art for the unincorporated areas of the county.
