Anna Walker is the Species Survival Officer for Invertebrate Pollinators at the Albuquerque BioPark. In this position she works to assess the conservation status of certain insect groups on the IUCN Red List of threatened species.

Anna has worked on moths in Hawai'i, North American Fireflies, and various Butterfly species found right here in New Mexico. Some of her previous work on insects includes biodiversity surveys of ground beetles in Idaho and Utah, research on the use of parasitoid wasps to protect crops from insect pests and investigations of the impact of climate warming on grasshopper communities of the Front Range in Colorado.
