NOTIFICATION OF DECISION

SARA CORDOVA (ROBERT RANDAZZO, AGENT) request(s) a special exception to Section Pg. 103 NOB HILL HIGHLAND SDP: a VARIANCE of 30" to the 18" maximum allowed letter height for a proposed wall sign on all or a portion of Lot(s) 8-10, Block(s) 29, VALLEY VIEW ADDN zoned CCR-3, located at 4500 CENTRAL AVE SE (K-17)

**STATEMENT OF FACTS:** The applicant, Sara Cordova, requests a variance of 30” to the 18” maximum allowed letter height for a proposed wall sign. Robert Randazzo, agent for the applicant, and Sara Cordova testified at the hearing. Ms. Cordova stated that she has owned Loyola’s Family Restaurant for approximately 22 years. In May, 2011, the applicant obtained a sign permit; however, were told that the Nob Hill Highland Sector Development Plan was phasing out pole signs. The allowable type of signage does not allow individual letters to exceed 18” in height. A sign with letters of this size, would make it very difficult to see from Washington Avenue, which could negatively impact their business. This request is for the upper case letter to be 4’ in height with the lower case letters to be 18”. The total square footage of the sign will be 120 sq ft which is below the 20% requirement. There is a letter of support from the Highland Business and Neighborhood Association noted in the file. The yellow sign was posted. There was no opposition to this request at the hearing, nor is there any opposition noted in the file.

Based on all of the testimony and a review of the entire file, it is determined that there is substantial evidence to make the following findings and conclusions:

**FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS:** I find that this parcel is exceptional as compared to other parcels in the vicinity and, therefore, it meets the test for the granting of a variance as provided for by Section 14. 16. 4. 2. I further find that, as a result of the exceptional aspect of the property, the regulations produce an unnecessary hardship in that it will limit the owner’s reasonable use of the property and/or deprive the owner of a reasonable return on the property. Furthermore, I find that the particular variance is appropriate to prevent the unnecessary hardship and further find that the variance will differ from development which will be permitted under the existing regular zoning regulations no more than what is necessary to overcome the unnecessary hardship. Finally, the variance will not significantly interfere with the enjoyment of other land in the vicinity and is consistent with the spirit of the Zoning Ordinance, substantial justice and the general public interest.

**DECISION:** Approved.

The approval is subject to the submitted site plan, as required. Any substantial changes to the site plan, as determined by the Zoning Enforcement Division, shall require the scheduling of an additional Public Hearing.

A Building Permit must be applied for at the Building Permit Desk which is located at the Plaza del Sol Building, Ground Level on the east side of the lobby.

**If you wish to appeal this decision, you may do so by 5:00 p.m., on December 7, 2011 in the manner described below:**

Appeal is to the Board of Appeals within 15 days of the decision. A filing fee of \$105.00 shall accompany each appeal application, as well as a written explanation outlining the reason for appeal and a copy of the ZHE decision. Appeals are taken at 600 2nd Street, Plaza Del Sol Building, Ground Level, Planning Application Counter located on the west side of the lobby. **Please present this letter of notification when filing an appeal.** When an application is withdrawn, the fee shall not be refunded.

An appeal shall be heard by the Board of Appeals within 45 days of the appeal period and concluded within 75 days of the appeal period. The Planning Division shall give written notice of an appeal, together with a notice of the date, time and place of the hearing to the applicant, a representative of the opponents, if any are known, and the appellant.

Please note that pursuant to Section 14. 16. 4. 4. (B)., of the City of Albuquerque Comprehensive Zoning Code, you must demonstrate that you have legal standing to file an appeal as defined.

You will receive notice if any other person files an appeal. If there is no appeal, you can receive building permits any time after the appeal deadline quoted above, provided all conditions imposed at the time of approval have been met. However, the Zoning Hearing Examiner may allow issuance of building permits if the public hearing produces no objection of any kind to the approval of an application. To receive this approval, the applicant agrees in writing to return the building permit or occupation tax number.

Successful applicants are reminded that other regulations of the City must be complied with, even after approval of a special exception is secured. This decision does not constitute approval of plans for a building permit. If your application is approved, bring this decision with you when you apply for any related building permit or occupation tax number. Approval of a conditional use or a variance application is void after one year from date of approval if the rights and privileges are granted, thereby have not been executed or utilized.
