SECTION 19 OF THE CRIMINAL CODE RELATED TO OFFENSES 6 RELATING TO PUBLIC ORDER AND SAFETY. 7 WHEREAS, the City of Albuquerque operates ABQ Ride and Sun Van 8 9 Paratransit which provide transit services to the Citizens of Albuquerque and 10 Bernalillo County, providing millions of rides a year to people of all abilities; Bracketed/Strikethrough Material] - Deletion 11 and Bracketed/Underscored Material] - New 12 WHEREAS, public transit exists as a public service that provides a mobility option for those who either forgo the use of a personal vehicle for any 13 14 number of reasons, including financial situations, a desire to reduce one's environmental impact, or whose disabilities prevent them from using a 15 16 personal vehicle; and **17** WHEREAS, these services are not only a low-emissions and zero fare 18 alternative to automobiles for commuters and disabled individuals who are 19 unable to operate a private vehicle, but they are the primary means of 20 transport for tens of thousands of persons who qualify as "Transit Dependent" in Bernalillo County as defined by the Federal Transit 21 22 Administration of the United States Department of Transportation; and 23 WHEREAS, providing all members of the community access to free 24 transit services furthers the City of Albuquerque's commitment to transit

ALBUQUERQUE:

1	WHEREAS, the people of Albuquerque, through the City of
2	Albuquerque, completed a significant investment to develop an easily
3	accessible rapid transit bus system along Central Avenue, and the best way
4	for them to benefit from its services is by offering them free access; and
5	WHEREAS, a zero-fare model alleviates the need to staff the rear-door of
6	an ART Motor-coach to verify passengers have paid their fares; and
7	WHEREAS, the City of Albuquerque has provided free transit service on
8	Albuquerque Rapid Transit for most of the line's operation since its initial
9	operation date of November 30, 2019 and the City Council has determined that
10	permanent free transit service should be offered to riders on this route; and
11	WHEREAS, to ensure that transit service is equally accessible to
12	people of all abilities, the City Council and Transit Department have
13	determined that Sun Van services should also be free; and
14	WHEREAS, the City Council and Transit Department have identified
15	strategies for streamlining the qualification process for accessing Sun Van
16	services that remains in compliance with Federal Transit Administration
17	Americans with Disabilities Act Para-Transit requirements and standards; and
18	WHEREAS, offering a zero-fare paratransit service is critical to ensuring
19	access for disabled persons to medical care, economic opportunities, and
20	socializing events and such a service helps foster an equitable community by
21	increasing access to jobs, activities, and commerce for individuals who are
22	unable to access these opportunities otherwise; and
23	WHEREAS, as more zero-fare bus service is offered throughout the City,
24	there will likely be a greater demand for adequate security officer staffing,
25	along with proper enforcement mechanisms in order to ensure public safety;
26	and
27	WHEREAS, as security officers assume more duties and responsibilities
28	on buses, at bus stops, and at bus stations, they will also be subject to a wider
29	variety of disturbances that require a broader range of enforcement
30	procedures that are allowed within their authority as security officers.
31	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF

1	SECTION 1. Section §7-2-1-1 ROA 1994, "FARES AND PASSES," is
2	amended by inserting new paragraphs (A) and (B) and re-lettering all
3	subsequent paragraphs accordingly:
4	"(A) The Albuquerque Rapid Transit Lines shall be free.
5	(B) Regular Fare Sun Van, shall be a free fare upon qualification for the
6	service through the Transit Department's Qualification Process."
7	SECTION 2. Section §12-2-19 ROA 1994, "RESISTING, OBSTRUCTING OR
8	REFUSING TO OBEY AN OFFICER," is amended by inserting paragraph (B)
9	and re-lettering all subsequent paragraphs accordingly:
10	"(B) Knowingly obstructing, resisting or opposing any individual employed
11	by the City for the purposes of maintaining security within the city, City
12	facilities and/or the City's transit system, including City buses and bus stops."
13	SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, paragraph, sentence,
14	clause, word or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or
15	unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not
16	affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this ordinance. The Council
17	hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each section,
18	paragraph, sentence, clause, word or phrase thereof irrespective of any
19	provision being declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid.
20	SECTION 4. COMPILATION. Sections 1-2 of this ordinance shall be
21	incorporated in and made part of the Revised Ordinances of Albuquerque,
22	New Mexico, 1994.
23	SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance takes effect five days after
24	publication by title and general summary.
