1 RESOLUTION
2 CONCERNING THE REGULAR MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE
3 CITY OF ALBUQUERQUE, NEW MEXICO ON TUESDAY, THE SIXTH DAY OF
4 OCTOBER 2015.

5 WHEREAS, a regular municipal election is required to be held in the City of
6 Albuquerque on Tuesday the 6th day of October 2015, pursuant to City Charter
7 Article II, section 1, at which election the offices of City Councilor for Districts
8 2, 4, 6, and 8 will be filled.

9 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF
10 ALBUQUERQUE:

11 Section 1. A regular municipal election shall be held in the City of
12 Albuquerque, New Mexico on Tuesday, October 6, 2015.

13 Section 2. At this election four (4) Councilors shall be elected, one to
14 represent each of the following Council Districts for a four (4) year term
15 beginning on December 1, 2015: 2, 4, 6, and 8. The boundaries of each
16 Council District are identified by the precincts listed in Appendix A of the
17 Albuquerque City Charter.

18 Section 3. Persons submitting petitions in accordance with Article II,
19 Section 3 of the City Charter, for the Office of Councilor, persons submitting
20 petitions were required to file such petitions in the Office of the City Clerk
21 beginning at 8:00 a.m. on May 1, 2015 and no later than 5:00 p.m. on June 28,
22 2015.

23 Section 4. A candidate for office, or their representative, shall file a
24 declaration of candidacy in the Office of the City Clerk between the hours of
25 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, August 11, 2015.

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1 Section 5. Write in candidates for the office shall file a declaration of write
2 in candidacy on August 18, 2015 before 5:00 p.m. at the Office of the City
3 Clerk. The ballot for each position where there is a declared write in candidate
4 shall contain a space for a qualified elector to write in the name of one
5 declared write in candidate and such space shall be identified as, “declared
6 write-in candidate”.

7 Section 6. Questions to be submitted to the voters, if any, shall be
8 authorized by separate resolution of the City Council.

9 Section 7. All persons desiring to vote at this election shall be registered
10 to vote within the City of Albuquerque. Any person who is otherwise qualified
11 to vote and who is not currently registered may register at the office of the
12 Bernalillo County Clerk not later than 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, September 8,
13 2015.

14 Section 8. The polls for this election shall open at 7:00 a.m. and shall close
15 at 7:00 p.m. on October 6, 2015.

16 Section 9. Absentee voting shall take place as authorized by law. Eligible
17 voters may request applications for absentee ballots from the Office of the
18 City Clerk, 600 2nd Street NW, Plaza del Sol Building, 7th Floor, Albuquerque,
19 New Mexico. Eligible voters may also request an application for an absentee
20 ballot in person, via email to absenteeapplication@cabq.gov, or by calling 311.
21 Completed applications shall be returned to the City Clerk prior to 5:00 p.m. on
22 October 2, 2015. The City Clerk may issue absentee ballots to approved
23 applicants beginning on September 1, 2015 until 5:00 p.m. on October 2, 2015.
24 Absentee ballots must be received by the City Clerk through the mail or by
25 hand delivery no later than 7:00 p.m. October 6, 2015, the day of the election.

26 Section 10. Absentee ballots may be marked in person at the Office of the
27 City Clerk and at the City Records Center, 604 Menaul NW, Albuquerque, New
28 Mexico, beginning on Tuesday, September 1, 2015 and not later than 5:00 p.m.
29 Tuesday, September 15, 2015.

30 Section 11. Early Voting shall begin on Wednesday, September 16, 2015
31 and end on Friday, October 2, 2015 at the Office of the City Clerk and the other
32 designated Early Voting Locations on Exhibit A attached hereto. Early Voting

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1 shall take place during the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Monday through
2 Friday.

3 Section 12. In accordance with Section 1-3-4 NMSA 1978, the City Clerk
4 shall consolidate precincts, allowing voters to cast their ballot at any Voting
5 Center open for Early Voting, or on Election Day, regardless of the precinct in
6 which the voter is registered. Municipal Voting Centers shall be placed
7 throughout the City.

8 Section 13. There will be Twelve (12) Early Voting Locations and Fifty
9 Three (53) Voting Centers open on Election Day throughout the City of
10 Albuquerque.

11 Section 14. A list of the locations of the Early Voting Locations, Voting
12 Centers and the consolidation of precincts is attached to this Resolution as
13 Exhibit A. The consolidation of precincts and the locations of the Voting
14 Centers are approved by the Council.

15 Section 15. Voters shall mark paper ballots. Ballots cast during Early
16 Voting and Election Day shall be electronically tabulated after the polls close
17 on Election Day. Absentee ballots shall be electronically tabulated pursuant
18 to §2-4-18 ROA 1994.

19 Section 16. This regular municipal election resolution shall be published
20 once within fifteen (15) days of adoption and again not less than sixty (60)
21 days prior to the election or more than seventy-five (75) days prior to the
22 election.

23 Section 17. For further information concerning this election, consult the
24 Office of the City Clerk, 600 2nd Street NW, Albuquerque, New Mexico, by email
25 at cityclerk@cabq.gov and online at www.cabq.gov/clerk.

26 Section 18. The officers of the City are hereby authorized and directed to
27 take all action necessary and appropriate to effectuate the provisions of this
28 resolution.

29 Section 19. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, paragraph, sentence,
30 word, or phrase of this resolution is for any reason held to be invalid or
31 unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not
32 affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this resolution. The Council
33 hereby declares that it would have passed this resolution and each section,


1 paragraph, sentence, word or phrase thereof irrespective of any provision
2 being declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid.



EXHIBIT A

Because of the nature of utilizing Voting Centers, precincts are not assigned a specific polling location for Early Voting or on Election Day. For purposes of consolidating precincts, the City is consolidated into one precinct – CP1. The Office of the City Clerk will assign numbers to the Municipal Voting Centers for organizational purposes following approval of the City Council.

The Office of the City Clerk wishes to make clear to all City Voters that they may cast their ballots at any one of the Twelve (12) Early Voting locations or at any one of the Fifty Three (53) Municipal Voting Centers on Election Day, October 6, 2015. The Early Voting locations and Municipal Voting Centers are in addition to the voter's ability to vote via Absentee Ballot as described in the body of the Resolution.





Cover Analysis

1. What is it?

Regular Municipal Election Resolution. This Resolution is required by State election law to authorize the regular municipal election of October 6, 2015.

2. What will this piece of legislation do?

This Resolution sets the date for the Regular Municipal Election as scheduled by the City Charter; identifies pertinent election dates for declarations of candidacy, write in candidates, early voting and absentee voting; and, identifies the polling locations for the election.

3. Why is this project needed?

The 2015 municipal election is required to elect City Councilors from Districts 2, 4, 6 and 8; and, to allow any municipal bonds, City Charter amendments or other allowed matters to be placed before the electorate.

4. How much will it cost and what is the funding source?

The 2015 regular municipal election has a proposed budget of \$826,474
