O-24-18 SPONSORED BY: Tammy Fiebelkorn, Brook Bassan, Klarissa Peña 1 **ORDINANCE** 2 AMENDING § 2-11-17 OF THE CITY OF ALBUQUERQUE CODE OF 3 ORDINANCES TO IMPROVE THE CITY'S GRANTS ADMINISTRATIVE 4 PROCESSES. 5 WHEREAS, the City of Albuquerque pursues federal, state, and non-profit 6 grant funding opportunities. To maintain an effective grants program, the City 7 regularly reviews and updates the grants administrative process to improve 8 efficiency in applying for grants and incorporating grant awards into its 9 budgets: and 10 WHEREAS, the Charter of the City of Albuquerque, assigns the City Bracketed/Strikethrough Material] - Deletion 11 Council the responsibility to review and approve the budgets, appropriations, Bracketed/Underscored Material] - New 12 and financial commitments of the City, including grant applications and grant 13 awards; and 14 WHEREAS, § 2-11-17 of the City's Code of Ordinances requires that an 15 application or proposal for a federal or state grant shall be submitted to the 16 City Council for review and approval prior to the submittal of such application 17 or proposal to any federal or state agency; and 18 WHEREAS, by approving grant applications and awards, the City Council 19 provides a public review of a financial commitment on the part of the City and 20 protects against encumbering the City with expenditures, capital costs, and 21 future operations costs that do not benefit the community; and 22 WHEREAS, there is often a short timeline between when the Notice of 23 Funding Opportunity is issued for a grant and the deadline for applying for the 24 grant; and 25 WHEREAS, the Administration historically issues a Resolution for approval

of a grant application. It is often not possible for a Resolution to be prepared

1	and adopted before the grant's application filing date due to the time required
2	for a Department to prepare a grant application, draft an application
3	Resolution, submit it to the Administration for review, and then have it
4	introduced and heard by the City Council; and
5	WHEREAS, a more efficient legislative process for acquiring City Council
6	approval would be for the Administration to submit Executive
7	Communications to City Council for approval in those cases where the
8	application criteria required by the granting agency does not require that the
9	application be adopted as policy; and
10	WHEREAS, the process of submitting a grant application for approval can
11	be further expedited by amending the City Council Rules of Procedure to not
12	require Fiscal Impact Analyses for Executive Communications and
13	Resolutions for grant applications, as there would be no fiscal impact until
14	grants are awarded. This, in turn, enables departments to concurrently begin
15	preparing grant applications and start the routing process for an Executive
16	Communication or Resolution; and
17	WHEREAS, to further expedite Executive Communications moving through
18	the legislative process, a Rules Amendment to the City Council Rules of
19	Procedure should be made to allow Executive Communications for grants to
20	be held over, as is done with Executive Communications for Reports and
21	Contract Extensions/Supplements; and
22	WHEREAS, given these changes to § 2-11-17 and the City Council Rules of
23	Procedure, City Council would have sufficient time to approve Executive
24	Communications before grants are awarded, and if City Council were to not
25	approve submittal of the grant application they can do so before one is
26	awarded; and
27	WHEREAS, an additional process that the Administration has employed to
28	expedite grant application approvals by the City Council is to submit Omnibus
29	Resolutions that list grant applications for which the City anticipates it will
30	submit for funding in the following six months. This process has been
31	effective and should be codified into the City Code of Ordinances and should

be expanded to also include Executive Communications; and

- 1 WHEREAS, to ensure that the City Council is regularly updated on City
- 2 Departments' progress in applying for grants, the Administration, on a
- 3 semiannual basis, shall file an Executive Communication with a list of all
- 4 grants applied for by all City Departments.
- BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF 5
- 6 **ALBUQUERQUE:**
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 2-11-17 ROA 1994, is amended as follows:
- 8 "(A) Any application or proposal for a grant with a matching requirement
- 9 shall be submitted to the City Council in the form of an Executive
- 10 Communication for review and approval at the same time as the submittal of
- 11 such application or proposal to any grantor. Executive Communications shall
- 12 include an interoffice memorandum and a copy of the executive summary of
- 13 the grant application or a copy of the grant application. The total City
- 14 obligation shall be included in the interoffice memorandum. A fiscal impact
- 15 analysis is not required to be submitted with the Executive Communication for
- 16 a grant application.
 - (1) The Council may approve, take no action, reject the proposed agreement, or recommend revisions thereof with or without conditioning approval on the adoption of such revisions.
 - (2) If the Council rejects the application, the application shall be withdrawn by the Department that submitted the application.
 - (3) If the Council rejects the application, the Department shall not enter into a grant agreement with the grantor.
 - (4) The Mayor may withdraw the proposed agreement at any time from the Council and may present revisions thereof. In the event of withdrawal, the proposed agreement shall be a nullity. In the event of revision, the provisions set forth in divisions (A) and (B) of this section shall apply to the same extent as if a new proposal were being made.
 - (B) If, after Council approval of the application, conditions are added to the grant award, which have not been approved by the Council and which have major financial or policy implications for the City, the final grant agreement shall be submitted to the Council for approval in accordance with the procedures set forth in Section A.

- (C) The Mayor, upon receiving notification that the City has been awarded a grant, shall submit a Resolution to Council to appropriate the funds.
- (D) Twice yearly, in July and January, the Administration shall submit an Executive Communication detailing all grant applications for the previous six months. This report shall include total project cost, grant funding requests, local match funding/in-kind contributions, and any grant awards received."

SECTION 2. COMPILATION. SECTION 1 of this ordinance shall amend, be incorporated in, and made part of the Revised Ordinances of Albuquerque, New Mexico, 1994.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY. If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, word or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this ordinance. The Council hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each section, paragraph, sentence, clause, word or phrase thereof irrespective of any provision being declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect five days after publication by title and general summary.
