Administration to the City Council, the following procedures shall apply. For

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- the purpose of computing the deadline to transmit an item to the City Council,
 unless otherwise stated, days shall be computed using calendar days.
- (1) The City Administration shall deliver both a printed hard copy and an
 electronic copy of the item to the Council Services Office. The printed hard
 copy shall include a transmittal memo that lists all item(s) being submitted.
 Council Services shall review the transmittal memo, sign and date to
- 7 document receipt of the item(s), and provide the City Administration with a
- 8 copy of the completed transmittal memo.
- 9 (2) Any items transmitted after the close of business (5:00 PM) on the date 10 on which they are due to the City Council shall be deemed untimely, unless an 11 after-hours transmittal is approved in writing by the City Council President.
- 12 Upon such written approval, the City Administration shall immediately provide
- 13 an electronic copy of the item via email to the City Council President, Director
- of Council Services, and Clerk of the Council. Any after-hours transmittals
- shall follow the procedures outlined in subsection (1) above, except that the
- 16 printed hard copy shall be delivered to the City Council Services Office on the
- 17 following business day."
- SECTION 2. Section 1-1-15 of the Revised Ordinances of Albuquerque, 19 1994, is hereby amended as follows:
 - "§ 1-1-15 EFFECTIVE DATE OF ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS.
- 21 An ordinance shall not become effective until five days after it has been
- 22 published, unless passed and approved as an emergency measure, in which
- 23 event it shall become effective immediately following publication or at a
- 24 subsequent date determined by Council. A resolution shall become effective
- 25 immediately upon the earliest of the following actions:
 - (1) The Mayor signs the resolution;
 - 27 (2) After ten days, if the Mayor does not veto the resolution; or
- 28 (3) If the resolution is vetoed by the Mayor, at the conclusion of the City
- 29 Council meeting at which the veto is overridden."
 - 30 SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY. If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause,
 - 31 word or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or
 - 32 unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not
 - 33 affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance. The Council

	4	SECTION 4. COMPILATION. Sections '1' and '2' of this Ordinance amend,
