ENACTMENT NO. 3-2023-103 COUNCIL BILL NO. __R-23-191 SPONSORED BY: Pat Davis, by request 1 RESOLUTION 2 RELATING TO THE REDEVELOPMENT, LEASING AND SALE OF A 3 METROPOLITAN REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT WITHIN THE 4 CENTRAL/HIGHLAND/UPPER NOB HILL METROPOLITAN REDEVELOPMENT AREA CONSISTENT WITH THE TERMS OF THE CENTRAL/HIGHLAND/UPPER 5 6 NOB HILL METROPOLITAN REDEVELOPMENT PLAN; APPROVING THE METROPOLITAN REDEVELOPMENT APPLICATION ENTITLED "THE SIXTY-SIX 7 REDEVELOPMENT TAX ABATEMENT APPLICATION"; AUTHORIZING THE 8 9 **ACQUISITION OF LAND AND EXISTING IMPROVEMENTS AND** 10 CONSTRUCTION OF A BUILDING WITHIN THE CENTRAL/HIGHLAND/UPPER 11 NOB HILL METROPOLITAN REDEVELOPMENT AREA: AUTHORIZING THE Bracketed/Underscored Materiall - New 12 DISPOSITION BY LEASE AND SALE OF THE CITY'S INTEREST IN SUCH 13 PROJECT TO FUNDERO DEVELOPMENT, INC., ITS SUCCESSORS AND **Bracketed/Strikethrough Material** 14 ASSIGNS; AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF A LEASE 15 AGREEMENT, IN FORM, AND OTHER DOCUMENTS IN CONNECTION WITH 16 THE PROJECT; MAKING CERTAIN DETERMINATIONS AND FINDINGS 17 RELATING TO THE PROJECT; RATIFYING CERTAIN ACTIONS TAKEN 18 PREVIOUSLY: AND REPEALING ALL ACTIONS INCONSISTENT WITH THIS 19 RESOLUTION. 20 WHEREAS, the City of Albuquerque (the "City") is a legally and regularly 21 created, established, organized and existing municipal corporation of the 22 State of New Mexico (the "State"); and 23 WHEREAS, the City desires to promote redevelopment in areas designated 24 as blighted areas so as to promote neighborhood stabilization by providing

affordable housing, convenient services, creating new jobs, upgrading area

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1	buildings, infrastructure and housing for such areas and to promote public
2	health welfare, safety convenience and prosperity; and
3	WHEREAS, pursuant to the Metropolitan Redevelopment Code, Sections 3
4	60A-1 through 3-60A-13 and Sections 3-60A-14 through 3-60A-48, New Mexico
5	Statutes Annotated, 1978 Compilation, as amended (the "Act"), the City is
6	authorized to acquire, whether by construction, purchase, gift or lease, and to
7	finance, sell, lease, or otherwise dispose of, projects as defined in the Act; an
8	WHEREAS, the City Council (the "Council") has adopted an ordinance
9	establishing the Albuquerque Development Commission (the "Development
10	Commission") to review metropolitan redevelopment projects proposed to be
11	owned and leased by the City pursuant to City Resolution No. 16-1985, as
12	amended; and
13	WHEREAS, Fundero Development, Inc., a New Mexico limited liability
14	company (together with its successors and assigns, the "Company") has
15	presented to the Development Commission and the Council a proposed
16	metropolitan redevelopment project application (the "Plan") whereby the City
17	will, pursuant to the Act, acquire from the Company land and existing
18	improvements located within the City and within the Central/Highland/Upper
19	Nob Hill Metropolitan Redevelopment Area for redevelopment by the
20	lessee/purchaser thereof for a multi-family project (the "Project") consistent
21	with the Central/Highland/Upper Nob Hill Metropolitan Redevelopment Plan
22	and the Act; and
23	WHEREAS, under the Company's proposal, the City will effectuate the
24	transfer and sale of real property with the Company related to the Project, as
25	authorized under this Resolution (this "Resolution"); and
26	WHEREAS, under the Company's proposal, after the City's acquisition of
27	the Property through a special warranty deed or quitclaim deed (the "Deed"),
28	the City and the Company will enter into a Lease Agreement (the "Lease"),
29	pursuant to which the Company will lease and agree to purchase the land and
30	improvements comprising the Project from the City, and the Company shall
31	comply with the obligations incurred pursuant to the provisions of the Lease
32	and this Resolution; and

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1	WHEREAS, the Albuquerque Development Commission has reviewed the
2	Plan, has held a public hearing on the Project, as amended, and has
3	recommended approval of the Plan and Project by the Council; and
4	WHEREAS, the Plan and Project meets the objectives of the Act and will
5	benefit the City's efforts to revitalize the Central/Highland/Upper Nob Hill
6	Metropolitan Redevelopment Area of the City; and
7	WHEREAS, the Plan has been filed with the City Clerk and presented to the
8	Council; and
9	WHEREAS, the Council has held a public hearing on the Plan and the
10	Project; and
11	WHEREAS, the form of the Lease has been filed with the City Clerk and
12	presented to the Council (the Lease and Deed are collectively referred to in the
13	Resolution as the "Project Documents"); and
14	WHEREAS, the Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the
15	City to approve the Project and to execute and deliver the Project Documents,
16	and other documents related thereto; and
17	WHEREAS, the City is authorized to execute the Project Documents, in
18	form, under the Act and this Resolution, and has concluded that it is desirable
19	at this time to approve the Project which constitutes a valid public purpose.
20	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF
21	ALBUQUERQUE:
22	Section 1. RATIFICATION. All actions not inconsistent with the provisions
23	of this Resolution previously taken by the Council and the officials of the City
24	directed toward approval of the Plan and the Project should be approved and
25	the same hereby are ratified, approved and confirmed.
26	Section 2. FINDINGS. The Council hereby declares that it has considered all
27	relevant information presented to it relating to the Plan and the Project and
28	hereby finds and determines that approval of the Plan and the Project, and the
29	execution of the Project Documents, pursuant to this Resolution are
30	necessary and advisable and in the interest of and will promote the public
31	health, safety, morals, convenience, education, economy and welfare of the
32	City and the residents of the City. The Council finds that:

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- (1) The Plan and the proposed activities under the Plan aid in the elimination or prevention of slum or blight;
- 3 (2) The Plan conforms to the general plan for the City as a whole and the 4 terms of the Central/Highland/Upper Nob Hill Metropolitan Redevelopment 5 Plan;
- 6 (3) The Plan affords maximum opportunity consistent with the needs of 7 the community for the rehabilitation or redevelopment of the area by private 8 enterprise or persons, and the objectives of the Plan justify the proposed 9 activities as public purposes and needs:
- 10 (4) The developer of the Project property is the Company; and
- 11 (5) The Project property comprises of 96-unit multi-family development 12 on approximately 1.6 acres located on the northeast corner of Central and 13 Adams in Albuquerque, New Mexico, all within the Central/Highland/Upper 14 Nob Hill Metropolitan Redevelopment Area.
 - Section 3. THE PROJECT. The City shall acquire the Project for the purposes hereinabove described, and the Project shall be located at all times within the corporate limits of the City and within the Central/Highland/Upper Nob Hill Metropolitan Redevelopment Area.

Section 4. PLAN APPROVAL.

- A. The Plan in the form on deposit in the office of the City Clerk is hereby approved in all respects.
- B. Prior to execution of the Project Documents, the Company shall provide the City all documentation required to ensure conformance with the conditions for approval as recommended by the Albuquerque Development Commission.
- Section 5. AUTHORIZATION OF OFFICERS; APPROVAL OF DOCUMENTS; ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN.
- A. The form, terms and provisions of the Project Documents in the form on deposit in the office of the City Clerk are in all respects approved, authorized and confirmed.
- 31 B. The Mayor or Chief Administrative Officer of the City is authorized to 32 execute and deliver in the name and on behalf of the City, and the City Clerk or 33 Deputy City Clerk is hereby authorized to attest, as necessary, the Project

- 1 Documents with such changes therein as are not inconsistent with this
- 2 Resolution.
- 3 C. The Mayor, Chief Administrative Officer, Treasurer and City Clerk are
- 4 further authorized to execute, authenticate and deliver such certifications,
- 5 instruments, documents, letters and other agreements and to do such other
- 6 acts and things as are necessary or appropriate to consummate the
- 7 transactions contemplated by the Project Documents and the Plan.
- 8 D. The officers of the City shall take such action as is necessary to
- 9 effectuate the provisions of the Project Documents and shall take such action
- 10 as is necessary in conformity with the Act for the Project and for carrying out
- other transactions as contemplated by this Resolution and the Project
- 12 Documents.
- 13 E. The Project Documents shall not be executed until Construction of
- 14 the Project is complete, as exemplified by a final Certificate of Occupancy, or
- 15 prior at the sole discretion of the City. The Project Documents must be entered
- 16 into and effective within three years of the date of this Resolution.
- 17 Section 6. LEASE TERM. The Lease term shall not exceed seven years.
- 18 Section 7. INTENTIONALLY DELETED.
 - 19 Section 8. FINDINGS REGARDING PROPERTY TAX ABATEMENT AND
 - OTHER MATTERS. The Council makes the following determinations and
 - 21 findings:

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- A. The Company is committed to provide fair consideration under the
- Lease through planned improvements to the Project pursuant to the Project
- Documents and the Act and comply with the terms of the Lease.
 - B. It shall not be necessary to deposit any amount in a controlled
- account for the maintenance of the Project property.
- C. The Lease requires that the Company maintain the Project property
- in good repair and condition (excepting reasonable wear and tear) and carry
- all proper insurance with respect to the Project property.
- 30 D. In accordance with Section 7-36-3.1, NMSA 1978, as amended and
- 31 supplemented, the Project property shall be exempt from property taxation on
- 32 the improvements to the Project for the shorter of the period of time in which

Nothing contained in the Resolution or in the Project Documents or any other instrument shall be construed as obligating the City (except with respect to the Project property as provided in the Project Documents), nor as incurring a pecuniary liability or a charge upon the general credit of the City or against its taxing power, nor shall the breach of any agreement contained in this Resolution, the Project Documents or any other instrument be construed as obligating the City (except with respect to the Project property as provided in the Project Documents), nor as incurring a pecuniary liability or a charge upon the general credit of the City or against its taxing power, the City having no power to pay out of its general funds, or

Section 10. APPROVAL OF INDEMNIFICATION. The Council specifically approves the provisions of the Lease relating to indemnification which provide that the Company shall indemnify and hold harmless the City and its City Councilors, officials, members, officers, employees and agents against liability to the Company, or to any third parties that may be asserted against the City or its City Councilors, officials, members, officers, employees or agents with respect to the City's ownership of the Project property and arising from the condition of the Project property or the acquisition, construction and operation of the Project property by the Company, except to the extent Section 56-7-1, New Mexico Statutes Annotated, 1978 Compilation, applies, and except claims for any loss or damage arising out of or resulting from the gross negligence or willful misconduct of the City or any member, officer, employee or agent of the City.

Section 11. REPEALER. All bylaws, orders, resolutions and ordinances, or parts thereof, inconsistent with this Resolution are repealed by this Resolution but only to the extent of that inconsistency. This repealer shall not be construed to revive any bylaw, order, resolution or ordinance, or part thereof, previously repealed.

	J	Section 12. Severability. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision
