5. **Bernalillo Metro Detention Center**
 - Total population – 1848
 - There are 333 females, half claim to be transient
 - The MDC is partnering with UNM statistics so they can start running some data to see the nonviolent numbers. What is the cost, and what is the big picture?
 - In October, 128 third-degree felony bookings. During this month, they dismissed four cases. Those four cases averaged 6.3 days with MDC. There are two people sentenced to third-degree felonies and spent, on average, 218 days.
 - Third-degree felony cases are released to bond, CCD, or a third party with 106. They were with MDC for 25.3 days. There were 54 other releases.
 - The fourth-degree felonies in October were 669 arrests. About 120 people dropped on average, and 120 people spent 21.7 days in MDC.

- There were eleven county sentences. Spent an average of 54 days. There were 607 released through some bond, CCD, or other court release programs. They stayed, on average, 18 days with MDC. Others were 60 days.
