  - What happens with criminal law in the legislature
  - Challenges getting crime legislative passed
  - The number of challenges in crime bills
    - o Reduce the number of people becoming victims
    - o Reduce the number of people who commit crimes
  - Effective Deterrence -expectation you will get caught and these will be adverse consequences.
  - Difficult to get crime bills pass in the house due to a small number of individuals who have a background in law enforcement.
  - Barriers
    - o Not too many lawmakers know about criminal law.
    - o Lawmakers believe that they know more than they do.
    - o The idea to just imprison everyone who breaks the law.
    - o Guns; some believe they are the only cause, other believe they are the only solution.
    - o Money concerns take precedence over a good legislative process
    - Going through two committees and both chambers of the legislature is a consuming process of
  - Two Topics that do not garner bi-partisan support: abortion and guns
  - Accomplish in 2023
    - o Budget appropriated 100 million dollars for law enforcement recruit and hire.
    - o New Mexico is currently working with a surplus so hiring is a possibility.
    - o The two bills related to firearms that passed

- HB 306 Purchase of firearms used by others in a felony
- SB 133 Theft of catalytic converters and resale by second-hand metal dealers

- HB 9 Unlawful access to a firearm by a minor: an adult now liable for a felony charge if a felony is committed.
- SB43 Intimidation of election officials
- SB 215 Beastiality
- Retail crime issues
