6. Max Kauffman Attorney with Disability Rights New Mexico

• Max Kauffman discusses his views and experiences when working as a mental health attorney and interactions with police officers. He stated that if a public defender and a police officer can work together, then two different sides can work together to find common ground in moving forward. Aside from healing, we need to find some practical solutions in the area. An increase in police presence has a marginal effect on crime. But how officers present themselves in the community is essential.
