7. NE Area Commander Amy Sedler

- The month of December 8000 calls for service
- Numbers were based on the holiday season and an increase in shoplifting, larceny, auto theft, and other crimes.
- Under 300 traffic stops
- Month of December
 - Family offenses – domestic violence 380
 - Aggravated assaults and battery 89
 - Robberies 18
 - Auto theft 42
 - Commercial burglary 34
 - Residential burglary 33
 - Auto burglary 42
 - Total 22.8
- Holiday operations from the month of November to January 1 consist of Coronado and uptown
- Their goal was to get one specific individual who was a prolific shoplifting offender. The commander attended the Duke City crime stat meeting, less than 24 hours after they got him. They recognized his pattern and waited, but he was unfortunately booked and released, and he returned to his previous behavior.
- There are 55 officers in the next bid. Each officer is going to have a specific business they are going to check in with monthly and keep track through a data system. Watch commanders and Lt's monitor monthly and make sure officers make those check-ins.

8. Crime Prevention Specialist

- Officer assignments for block captains are suspended while they are doing their business. Neighborhood watch will continue.
