4. **Captain Joel Long of the NM Mounted Patrol**
  - NM Mounted Patrol is not an equine unit.
  - They were created in 1941.
  - The mounted patrol unanimously voted to create an intelligence unit
  - Focus on countering human trafficking.
  - A handful of analysts and sworn officers whose focus is on open source intelligence, also referred to as OSINT.
    - Taking information that's out there, free and public on the internet, correlating together and figuring out whose behind some of the human trafficking.
  - They concentrate on proactive, they seek out criminal sexual advertisements.
    - Identify the victim
    - Create a target package
    - Work with law enforcement partners to have operations and identify the human trafficker.
  - There is a subset where they are able to identify the trafficker without actually talking to the victim. Plus, they can build profiles of the traffickers and provide them to law enforcement partners for convictions.
  - Work with the US attorneys office, BCSO, and APD
  - High-risk victims unit – they pass information to the NM Mounted Patrol and tie everything together.
    - What they are trying to do is disrupt human trafficking
  - BCSO and Santa Fe have reserve units. Certain certifications require a verifying rating for referral grants and having a reserve unit.
  - In the north, they prioritize work with NM, and per the NM Administrative Code, they are reserved for NMSP.

- They are their own agency and completely separate ability to work with any agency. So any agency or individual officer can ask for assistance.

- Property Crime – 187
- Auto burglary – 54
- Residential burglary – 28
- Commercial burglary – 37
  - Commercial burglary in the NE, they have a burglary specifically to the speedway. If you see something, say something. Call 911. These burglaries happen between 11 pm and 4 am.
- Auto theft – 62
  - Increase in the uptown area, Coronado mall, and transit center
- Family offenses DV related – 363
- Disturbances – 566
- Aggravated assault and battery – 81
- Robberies – 23
- Traffic stops – 631
  - The traffic stops are for the month of January. The traffic stops increased from working with the traffic unit on operations. They did the drag racing operation and operation with in the uptown area.
- Total calls for service for the month of January – 7716
- Working towards a new big project should take effect in April
  - There are 55 officers in the NE
