4. **Bernalillo Metropolitan Detention Center Major Johnathan Pettis, Deputy Warden Juan Moniz, Daniel R. Trujillo, Communications Specialist**
 - Population: men 1570, women 318, total = 1835. The cap is 1950, due to the McClendon Settlement.
 - Demographics
 - 18-34 : 13.13%
 - 25-34: 1.66%
 - 35-44: 611 33%
 - 65-54: 278 15%
 - 55 and over: 134 6.75%
 - Motor stats
 - Felony – 41%
 - Misdemeanor – 3.46%
 - Other – 4.43%
 - Sentence – 5.94%
 - If someone is sentenced to more than 364 days, they go to state prison or the Department of Corrections. If the person is sentenced to less than 364 days, they start at MDC for court appearances. It is not up to MDC for sentencing; that is up to the courts.
 - The average is 132 days from arrest to booking to release.
 - Agency – APD is the highest agency that books, then BCSO 299, other (counties) 88, Probation 48, NMSP 42,

- They graduated 44 cadets today

5. ACS Jeffrey Bustamante

- It's going to be ACS's 5th anniversary in September
- They do 911 and 311 calls for service, non-medical, and non-criminal. A lot of behavioral health crises, welfare checks, wellness checks, suicide ideations, and unsheltered individuals.
- They have 2 new spaces. Their headquarters are in the International District. The first space is at the Fire Station 14 and the Southwest Public Safety Center. This location has 4 fire trucks, with APD, AFR, and ACS all housed here.
- Bilateral split – Teams on the eastside and westside for faster response.
- Street outreach program – A couple of individuals going into the highest-acuity unsheltered folks. They are working to stabilize the behavior. They partnered with UNM-H to stabilize medically and everything else.
- Running success rate over 80% of folks staying in housing.
- Working with area commanders like SE Area Commander Richards to identify who will benefit from stabilizing them.
- Field response division – admin, divisions that do policy and compliance.
- Staffing – they are budgeted for 141, and 10-11 will start the academy on Monday. They will have 3-4 vacancies.
- Violence Intervention Division – work with Albuquerque schools. They are trying to expand district-wide. There are the West Side High School, Atrisco Heritage, RFK Middle School, and West Mesa, where they started.
- Evaluations on clients – 84% reduction in minor offenses and 83% reduction in the school-based team.
- Working with CYRD on some kind of reentry program.
- Other programs continue – VIP violence intervention program, opioid prevention program, community-oriented response and assistance team.
- Next month might hit 150,000 calls. They get 3,000-4,000 calls a month, and 100-150 per day.
- Trauma recovery center – 200-300 a year, 200-300 a month, and 7-10 a day.
- Priority – suicide ideations/ referral from Lts.

 - The 4-man officer during the day went to the 6-man officers. All shifts got more officers.
 - Small medians – getting people off due to people getting hit.
