- 4. NW Area Commander David Saladin update
 - Every two weeks The Area Commanders present stats at the Duke City stats meeting.
 - Down in auto theft and auto burglaries/burglaries/aggravated assaults/sex crimes/ and robbery.
 - There is a 1% increase in shoplifting due to more stores reporting the shoplifting
 - The use of force is down in fraction of percentage.

- On April 12, 2023 there was a de-escalation training for businesses at Cottonwood mall.
- This week is there is a city-wide block captain conference at the APD academy from 8AM to 12 PM

6. SW Area Commander Renee Baraza

- Decrease in property crime, and down in double digits compared to last year.
- Violent crime trending in aggravated assaults. There is a spike in robbery.
- The special operations to catch the individual who is rising the robbery statistics.
- Auto theft are down compared to last year.
- Officers are using less force as compared to last year.

- 7. Albuquerque Police Department K-9 Squad

- Staff there are five handlers • One K-9 controller
- The K-9 unit are on call 24-7
- Dog goes home with the officer
- City compensates officers with dog food/ lodging
- Duration of training to be a K-9 Officer
- K-9 unit requires at least three years' service
- Applicants go through a 5-step process to become K-9
- Once accepted there is a 4-step training process
- 8. Ken Cox, Sr. Area Loss Prevention Manager for Ross Dress for Less PowerPoint presentation (1:16:00)
 - In 2006 ARAPA (Abuquerque Retail Asset Protection Association) got created.
 - They meet every 3rd Wednesday of the month with law enforcement.
 - Most retailers no longer apprehend because of the reliability
 - Focus on creating deterrence now
 - Felony shoplifting is \$500 or above
 - House Bill 234 aggregates shoplifting offenses.
 - Difference between robbery, shoplifting and aggravated assault.
