- 4. NW Area Command update Commander David Saladin
 - NW is good in every crime category
 - There are three PRTs going into investigations on Saturday. There is a rise in robberies due to shoplifters using weapons.
 - Use of Force is down.
 - The NW area commands is going after outstanding arrest warrants.
 - Northwest utilizes *shotspotter* technology to trace gunshots but it is limited.
 - Focus on traffic violations in different areas of the NW.

5. Pete Gelabert NW Crime Prevention Specialist

- July 29, 2023 from 10:00 to 2:00PM Community res. Event at McDonalds on 5700 McMahan NW
- August 1, 2023 is national night out
- NW Summerfest 8/5; Ventana Park

6. SW area command update Commander Renee Barraza

- Property crime down 20% year to date
- Commercial Robbery down 8% year to date
- Shoplifting down 16% year to date
- The PRT teams up with the Organized Crime Unit for the forty-five-day retail theft operation.
- Violent crimes

- Aggravated Assaults are varied, including domestic violence related, and road rage. About 30% of AA's are domestic violence.
- In April and May there was a spike in robberies. The officers are temporary working in robbery unit.
- Auto theft: apprehended the suspect person who took the stole a bait car. The year-to-date auto theft is up 16%.

7. APD Chief Harold Medina

- There are sixty cadets, twenty PSA's, ten PSA's clear background, and ten lateral officers, coming into APD.
- Within the two months APD hired one hundred officers.
- Starting the new "Speeding has a Name" campaign.
- Traffic divisions are going to a seven-day schedule.

8. Commander Kyle Hartsock – case catcher organized crime unit

- Prosecutor's Office is overburdened, each case takes 9-to-fifteen months to process
- Chambers of commerce received grants in 2019
- They must get the information from police to judge.
- Utilizing Case Catcher digital system now to keep up with cases
- Shield unit now inside the District Attorney's building
- Bail reform: No bail unless a prosecutor asks for it.
- Community discussion

9. Aja Brooks; Executive Assistant US Attorney

- Oversees the federal consent decree with APD and DOJ
- Functions mainly with community engagement and outreach CPC/CPOA and **AMICI**
- Encouraged the CPCs to make recommendations
- The US attorney will be attending national night out.
