- 1. Call to Order:** 6:00 PM
- 2. Approval of agenda** – Approved
- 3. Approval of Minutes** – Approved
- 4. NW Area Commander Chris Patterson**
 - In the NW Area Command, they were ahead by three officers at the beginning of the bid. The day shift squad has three officers retiring in December. There will be one new officer starting next week. The two starting officers will be on the day shift, one on the graveyard shift, and will begin at the end of the month.
 - Total of 50 plus three coming end of the month. In December, they will be down to 47 officers.
 - The crime trends
 - Aggravated assaults down 5%
 - Robberies down 10.5%
 - Sex crime up 28% (not reported right away)
 - Auto burglary down 10%
 - Burglary up 6% 14 more than last year. These are around storage units being broken into.
 - Shoplifting down 22%
 - Auto theft down 33% due to bait cars, LPRs (license plate readers), camera systems with LPRs built in vehicles, 2nd helicopter has an LPR system, and the drone first responder is operational with a 45-minute flight time.
 - West bluff substation – complex next to Walmart and Home Depot, the address is 2010 Coors, open 8 am to 4 pm M-F.
 - The request for speed cameras will vary by location.
 - Traffic tact plan
 - Citations 296 Traffic stops 853 3.4 citations per stop

- Traffic stops = 2957
- Coors, Unser, adding Irving, Kayenta, and Universe – Driving fast 303 citations and 75 traffic stops
- Unser/Rosa Parks 273 citations 73 Traffic stops
- McMahon 624 citations
- Montano 238 citations
- Rainbow – Paseo to Universe 264 citations
- Ladera 547 citations
- School zone priority with day and swing shift.
- Issues with encampments, more calls this time with issuing citations and arresting those with warrants.

6. Deputy Director Jasmin Basedario, Violence Intervention Program with ACS

- There are six specialty teams
- Works collaboratively with AFR, APD, BCSO, APS, and the Marshalls
- In 2022-2023, ACS acquired the VIP
- VIP – peer support work group that works closely with APD after a violent incident that happens around the city. APD will identify those who have the highest rate of retaliation.
- Hospital-based VIP – UNM hospital partnership, go along bedside and provide services.
- Opioid education and prevention program – works collaboratively with AFR. If any overdose, the individual gets put on a list for a follow-up for additional resources and gets them into treatment services.
- The ACS street outreach team is dedicated to homeless encampments and housing individuals. If the individual has a substance use problem, the team goes in to provide additional support.
- Community-oriented responsiveness – Trained like behavioral health responders and dispatched by 911 to go to calls with individuals with mental health problems.
- School violence intervention program – they are in a couple of schools from West Mesa, Atrisco, and Del Norte (newly added school). They provide full-time mentorship to those at risk of engaging in high-violent crime, who are already committed, or have pending charges.
- Earlier this year, they moved into a space that is being renovated, which is called the Trauma Recovery Center. They are opening next month.

7. NW Crime Prevention Specialist Pete Gelabert

- First business watch: The owner of Golden Corral will be the block captain. They'll have signs like the neighborhood watch.
