Our presentations started with the NW Area Command crime report that shows continued decreases in residential and commercial crime in the NW area command, month to month and year to date compared to last year. They continue to focus on traffic including noise and red light camera runners and on commercial burglaries and robberies. Shoplifting continues to be a challenge in all sectors of the city. The Northwest continues to lead the city in minimizing uses of force interactions. Crime Specialist Pete Gelabert gave an update on upcoming local outreach events with an opportunities to meet up at McDonalds for a gathering of police resources including K-9, robots, the mounted unit on their horses and more.
