Our presentations started with the NW Area Command crime report that shows continued decreases in residential and commercial crime in the NW area command, month to month and year to date compared to last year. APD continues to focus on traffic including noise and red light camera runners and on commercial burglaries and robberies. Shop-lifting continues to be a challenge in all sectors of the city. The Northwest continues to lead the city in minimizing uses of force interactions.
