 - Domestic violence is underreported
 - Respond to the community to provide the victims with resources that are available to help them get out of that cycle.
 - They have two full-time victim advocates, and they reach out to those who reported domestic violence.
 - no policy has been changed or made in regards to domestic violence.
 - Resources available from behavioral sciences for officers who need to talk to someone.

6. Commander Renee Barraza SW area command update

- Crime update for the last seven days
- Auto burglary spiked, there were three incidences within seven days.
- Commercial and residential burglaries increase from two to eight incidences.
- Shoplifting in the southwest is low.
- Violent crime reduction in the last seven days.
- In 2023 they finished strong and all crime were down except auto theft.
- In 2024 continue to trend downward and continue with their initiative.
- The shootings and murders went down in 2023 compared to 2022.
- The first homicide for 2024 was due to a road rage incident and it was solved with an arrest warrant.
- The annual bid is this Saturday.
- There are no officer vacancies in the SW, but there are three vacancies on the proactive response team.

- After the bid, he will invite the new officers of the SW area command to join the meeting and introduce themselves.
- There Cadet class 128 will be graduating this month, including five laterals. For the next four months, they will be on OJT (On-the-job training). The new class starting has around 50 cadets.
