    - Sex crimes down 36%

    - $\circ$  Burglaries (breaking and entering, residential and commercial) down 17.86%
    - Shoplifting up 77%
  - Everything south of I40 and West of the Rio Grande River. A lot of businesses are doing more reporting online and over the phone. The police department is partnering with local retailers.
  - The annual bid took place on 2/10/2024
    - o The SW is fully staffed with 47 officers
    - o There are fifty-one cadets currently on the job training. They should be done in May and after OJT they will be deployed to field services.
