- 4. APD Chief of Police Harold Medina Bi-Annual Report**
 - DOJ – APD is out of DOJ. The case was dismissed in May by the federal court, and in compliance for 22 months with all the requirements.
 - Recruiting – There are 905 officers. Currently 12 laterals in the 2nd lateral class this year. There are twelve laterals in the process of finishing. There are twenty-five cadets in a class, and 40 cadets on OJT; there are about 960-970 of the 1000 they are budgeted. Transit security is fully staffed and has six more positions open. Struggling with 911 operators and dispatchers.
 - Every major crime category is down.
 - Technology – drones, the first responder program, they are the third agency out of sight authorization from the FAA. The SE area command was the first to have 7-10 drones. In the future, every time ShotSpotter is activated within 90 seconds, a drone will be dispatched to fly over.
 - National Guard – continues to be successful. They are not in military uniform; they are in polo shirts. They are fitting well with the community. They save over 4,000 hours of scene security, and officers are able to respond to calls for service. They are enforcing misdemeanor enforcement and up to 50% on enforcement in felony crimes.
 - Juvenile crime – need to hold the juvenile accountable. Violent juveniles should be held in jail. Need resources available for juveniles.
- 5. University Area Commander Rey Del Greco**
 - There is a 74% reduction in homicides in the university area command this year.
 - An 80% reduction since 2024 in commercial burglary throughout May. With the enforcement and proactive patrol reduced to 14%. That is 1100 felony cases to the DA's office.
