 - TEAM – Targeted Enforcement Active Monitoring operation
 - Funded by the downtown businesses
 - The TEAM goes out one day of the week to go around and do zero-tolerance enforcement to try to reduce crime downtown.

- In August 2022 through Albuquerque One, businesses and residents donated about \$150,000 for overtime that lasted a year; currently there is \$39,000 that will last until the end of May 2024. Chief Medina was able to secure extra funds to get through the rest of the 2024 year.
- The TEAM reviews data from the downtown area from Broadway to 12th Street and Lomas to Coal to figure out the best time to deploy a specific unit.
- Last year all crime was down except for aggravated assault throughout the city. In the downtown area auto theft is estimated to be down 10%.
- There were 7000 citations written, 1100 traffic stops, and 220 calls for service. Including fifty-four towed vehicles, the majority of which were DWI and no insurance.

- The Valley Area Command has the downtown public safety district that has two officers assigned to it.
- VA Area Command crime stats year-to-date:
 - All crime was down except aggravated assaults
 - Robbery was down 22%
 - Sex crimes down 13%
 - Auto burglary is down 17%
 - Residential/Commercial burglary down 20%
 - Shoplifting down 20%
 - Homicides were even
 - Vandalism down 5%
 - Larceny is down 15%
 - Auto theft 15%
 - Narcotic offenses up 110% (most likely arrests)
 - Weapons Violations up 20%
