- 5. Public Safety in Albuquerque for Teens and Youth; Gabriella Blakey, Chief Operating Officer- APS; Lt. Steve Mares- APS Police; Vicki Price, Director of Counseling - APS
 - Mrs. Blakey oversees the APS Police Department, transportation, and food services
 - APS Schools feature secure vestibules, are trending toward security fencing, and buzzing visitors in
 - Attempt prevention of problems rather than response
 - Utilize restorative practices in which students must suffer consequences for causing issues
 - Role is getting kids to and from school safely, "Door-to-Door"
 - Misconception between bullying and conflicts.
 - Teach kids to talk to each other when they have conflicts. (Hand out attached)
 - Social media safety / "stranger danger"
 - There are 255 school counselors
 - There are drug and alcohol counselors in the high school and they are beginning to be in the middle schools. In the elementary schools they started doing prevention of drugs and alcohol.
 - \circ Handle with care is an initiative with the city, and county. Their initiative is to get kids used to first responders and interact with first responders so they are not afraid of them.
 - Active shooter training for all staff and teachers

6. Valley Area Command crime report, Crime prevention specialist Lamont Davis

- May and June statistics
- Auto burglary 14(May) 6(June)
- Commercial Burglary 17 15
- Residential burglary 11 10
- Auto thefts 30 15
- Robbery auto 3 2
- Commercial robbery 7 1
- Robbery to an individual 7-0
- Residential robbery 2 1
- Concern and issues auto thefts are up, don't leave valuables in vehicles. For example, don't leave guns in vehicles because they can get stolen and used for crimes around the city.
- Calls for service was high.
- Reach out to multiple agencies within the city to allocate resources where issues were found.

7. APD Chief of Police Harold Medina

- Property crime down 12%
- Violent crime down 8%
- Traffic citations up 56%
- Clearance is at 90
- DOJ 92% in compliance
- Recruiting: there are fifty plus cadets and eleven laterals. There are about 900 officers.
