4. **Angel Garcia LULAC Council 57 Announcement**
 - Thanksgiving Food Drive

 - Giving out the food box on November 20, 2021
 - If possible to donate a \$20.00 gift card from a grocery store (ex. Smiths)

5. **Nicole Rogers Office of Equity and Inclusion**
 - Starting October 2, 2021, through February, there will be a community block party every Saturday. It is a proven crime reduction strategy that cities across the country also do.
 - October block party will be in the International District.
 - All resources will be available at these community block parties, and laptops will be provided to sign up for the resources.
 - There is a link to sign up to have a table set up and volunteer requested for the events.
 - The Wednesdays before the event, OEI will be going out into the neighborhood to give flyers about the community block parties.
6. **Commander of Traffic Division Joseph Viers Special Operations – Vision Zero**
 - A strategic workgroup convened with numerous entities within and outside the city. The Vision Zero goal is to reduce traffic fatalities to zero by the year 2040.

- There are traffic fatalities in Albuquerque every year, and it is a nationwide problem.
- Measures beyond enforcing traffic laws against speeding to reduce pedestrian, bicyclist and vehicle accidents include street signage, lighting, traffic calming and speed limit reductions.
- Road assessments and crash review are done jointly among NM DOT, Department of Municipal development and Vision Zero task force.

7. APD Accountability Bureau Interim Deputy Chief Cori Lowe

- APDAB is working with DOJ to improve investigations of levels two and three uses of force.
- The Settlement Agreement requires investigations to be completed in a timely and thorough manner.
- EFIT (External Force Investigation Team) has been brought on to help with the process and overall investigations. EFIT is comprised of people that are specialists and have knowledge of law enforcement.
- EFIT has gone out with the IAFD investigators. EFIT can take on a case if the internal investigation does not meet the deadline or if misconduct was found.
- On August 28, IAFD received a total of twenty-five sworn and civilian investigators, which puts them within the stipulated order.

- Lt. Chacon answered questions from the Council
 - Is entering the residence considered burglary or theft when an item gets taken while the owner is home? (Burglary involves breaking into a structure)
 - If we see a drug deal happening in front of us, do we call 911 or 242-COPS? (242-COPS)
- Priority System summarization

- Priority call one – life-threatening, armed robbery the offender threatens someone with a firearm or uses the firearm in the commission of a crime, with injuries or potential for serious injury
- Priority two call – ShotSpotter, accidental shooting, Domestic violence (verbal and physical abuse)
- Priority three – property crime, offender information, and after the fact.
- Priority four calls – alarm calls can either be a priority four or two.
