To provide public comments to the Council virtually, everyone must sign up by 4:00 pm on the day of the meeting by completing this web form https://www.cabq.gov/nov-21-2022-comment. For members of the public without internet service, you may call our office at 505-768-3100 for assistance.

The Council will take General Public Comment on any topic and on the meeting's specific agenda items, from up to a maximum of 30 people, on a first-come first-serve basis. Per Council rules, persons signing up to speak before the Council can sign up for General Public Comment and up to two agenda items per meeting. If speaking on a specific agenda item, comments must be germane to the item.

General Public Comment is near the beginning of the meeting. If you sign up to speak on a specific agenda item, your name will be called when that item is heard.

Note: Participants must sign up for public comment with the Zoom username or phone number that they will be entering the Zoom meeting with so that they can be identified when accessing the meeting. Persons who do not provide this information will not be allowed into the meeting, but may still view the meeting via YouTube live or in Zoom Webinar.

Participants will be an Attendee in the Zoom Webinar until the public comment period begins. The Zoom moderator will move you into the meeting room as Panelist when it's your turn to provide public comments.

Once in the Zoom meeting room, the participants must mute themselves and turn off their camera. The Zoom moderator will unmute and enable cameras (if applicable) at the time their name is called to provide public comment.

Participants will be able to view the meeting via Zoom while waiting for public comments, but participants can also watch on YouTube live at https://youtu.be/g4I1S7UsVis. The live streams can be accessed from most smart phones, tablets, or computers. The meetings are closed captioned and you may enable the closed captioning services on your television or device.

If you are watching on YouTube live, please note there is an approximately 10 second lag between the Zoom meeting room and YouTube. Please mute or pause the YouTube live stream once you are in the Zoom meeting room to avoid feedback.

Public comment will be limited to 2 minutes or less, depending on the number of speakers signed up. Your time will start when you begin speaking and you will be informed when your time has concluded, at which point your microphone will be muted and your camera will be turned off.
