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#### 2022 Redistricting Committee Communications Plan

#### **Overview**

All Redistricting Committee Meetings will adhere to the State Open Meetings Act. Agendas will be published at least 72 hours before a scheduled meeting.

City Council Staff will maintain the webpage for all the Redistricting Committee's information; <u>www.cabq.gov/2022redistricting</u>. The page contains background information on the Committee and process, membership information, project contact, and fields for members of the public to submit written comments and the ability to attach materials to be shared with the Committee. The webpage will be continually updated with each Committee meeting information, including agendas, Zoom links, presentation materials, and YouTube link for the public to watch live and/or the recording later. As the Committee develops work products, including conceptual maps, they will be published on the webpage.

In addition to electronic comment and map submissions, the public can contact Council staff for hard copies of materials or to submit hard copies of their comments.

Prior to April 6, 2022 Committee Meeting, DistrictR, a public mapping platform (<u>www.districtr.org</u>) will be available for the public to create and submit their own maps for Committee's review.
